In addition to information concerning threads, needles and fabrics, 4 projects will be used to teach different aspects of beginning sashiko designs. Since this type of stitching is time-involved, sashiko components will be introduced for you to finish at your leisure. Sashiko 101 PROJECTS include: a **Stenciled Block** (#0), a **Sashiko Pin Cushion** (#1), a **Needle Book** (#2), and a **Tote bag** (#3).
