

Beginning Applique Supply List -- Katrina Lamken

Eight (8) or more 9" squares of 100% cotton fabric. Four squares will be used for background, four for the hearts. A half-yard of two different fabrics is enough for the sample top shown.

Basic sewing supplies (i.e., thread, needles, straight pins, scissors for both paper and fabric). NOTE: Bring thread to match the background(s) and heart fabrics.

Sewing machine (bring machine appliqué feet, i.e. for zigzag (satin), blind hem stitch, blanket stitch, etc. in addition to your normal 1/4" foot)

Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler if you need to cut 9" blocks in class

Fine permanent pen/marker or pencil -- no ballpoint pens
Sharpie or Sakura Micro Pigma pens recommended

Fabric glue pen or stick -- must be "acid-free" and washable

Freezer paper

Fusible webbing (Steam-a-Seam or Wonder-Under)

Stabilizer (can use plain bond paper in a pinch)

Applique pressing sheet

Needles for hand appliqué (Bohin or Richard Hemming)

Marking pencils -- to contrast with your fabric -- Bohin or Karisma fabric pencils have a fine line and different color leads

Clover needle threader

Optional: Spray starch, small plastic cup, small paintbrush or Qtip
Thimble
