




Trés Chic Quilt

Cutting Directions:

Note: All strips are cut across the width of the fabric (perpendicular to selvages) unless noted otherwise.

A. 23794 Z: Main Print

- Cut four 3½" strips and one 14½" strip from the length of the fabric (parallel to the selvages). Cut two 3½" strips to 3½" x 92½" and two strips to 3½" x 84½". Cut the 14 ½" strip into twenty-two 4½" x 14½" rectangles.
- Use the remaining width to cut four 4½" squares and fifteen 6½" squares.

B. 23795 Z: White Feather Print

- Cut twenty four 2½" strips; subcut thirty 2½" x 10½" rectangles and thirty 2½" x 14½" rectangles. (You can cut two 14½" rectangles and one 10½" rectangle from one strip.) Use remainder of strips to cut sixty 2½" squares.
- Cut eighteen 2½" strips; subcut thirty 2½" x 6½" rectangles and thirty 2½" x 10½" rectangles. (You can cut three 10½" rectangles and one 6 ½" rectangle from one strip.) Use remainder of strips to cut sixty 2½" squares.

C. 23796 A: Tan Grass Print

- Cut three 6½" strips; subcut fifteen 6½" squares.

D. 23797 A: Tan Stone Print

- Cut eighteen 2½" strips; subcut thirty 2½" x 6½"

rectangles and thirty 2½" x 10½" rectangles. (You can cut three 10½" rectangles and one 6½" rectangle from one strip.) Use remainder of strips to cut sixty 2½" squares.

- Cut twenty-one 4½" strips; subcut (168) 4½" squares.

E. 23797 K: Gray Stone Print

- Cut eleven 2½" strips; subcut (168) 2½" squares.

F. 23798 A: Tan Bead Print

- Cut ten 2½" strips for binding.

G. 23078 K: Gray Tonal Texture Print


- Cut twenty four 2½" strips; subcut thirty 2½" x 10½" rectangles and thirty 2½" x 14½" rectangles. (You can cut two 14½" rectangles and one 10½" rectangle from one strip.) Use remainder of strips to cut sixty 2½" squares.

Construction:

NOTE: These blocks use the "sew & flip" technique for the triangle corners in order to achieve accurate blocks with an octagonal style. To make use of the discarded corner pieces, use a rotary cutter and ruler to cut the ¼" seam allowances. The resulting "discarded" triangles will be accurate and can be used in another project!

Block A:

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
2. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of one Fabric C $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (15) block centers.





3. Sew a Fabric B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to both sides of a block center. Press toward the rectangles. Sew a Fabric B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom; press. Repeat to make (15) units.

4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric G $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a unit from step 3. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the remaining corners of the unit. Repeat to make (15) units.

5. Sew a Fabric G $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to both sides of the unit from step 4. Press toward the rectangles. Sew a Fabric G $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom; press.

6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a unit from step 5. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the remaining corners of the unit. Repeat to make (15) units.

7. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric E $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a unit from step 6. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the remaining corners of the unit. Repeat to complete (15) blocks.

Block B:

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

2. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of one Fabric A $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (15) block centers.





3. Sew a Fabric D $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to both sides of a block center. Press toward the rectangles. Sew a Fabric D $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom; press. Repeat to make (15) units.

4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a unit from step 3. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the remaining corners of the unit. Repeat to make (15) units.

5. Sew a Fabric B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to both sides of the unit from step 4. Press toward the rectangles. Sew a Fabric G $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom; press.





6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a unit from step 5. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the remaining corners of the unit. Repeat to make (15) units.

7. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric E $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a unit from step 6. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the remaining corners of the unit. Repeat to complete (15) blocks.

Border Blocks:

1. With right sides together, place a marked Fabric D $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square on one end of a Fabric A $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the other end of the rectangle. Repeat to make (22) units.

2. With right sides together, place a marked Fabric E $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on one end of a unit from step 1. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat for the other end of the rectangle. Repeat to complete (22) border blocks.

Corner Border Blocks:

1. With right sides together, place a marked Fabric D $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square on one on top of a Fabric A $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Fabric A $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat to make (4) half-square-triangle units.


2. With right sides together, place a marked Fabric E $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on one end of a unit from step 1. Sew on the line and trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press toward the resulting triangle. Repeat to complete (4) blocks.





Assembly:

1. Refer to quilt image to sew blocks together into rows. Press seams in opposite directions from row to row.
2. Sew rows together to complete center of quilt. Press.



3. Sew six border blocks together to complete one side border. Press seams in opposite directions from corresponding quilt seams. Repeat to make two side borders. Refer to quilt image for placement and sew borders to quilt. Press toward borders.
4. Sew five border blocks together to complete a top/bottom border. Press seams in opposite directions from corresponding quilt seams. Repeat to make top and bottom borders.
5. Refer to quilt image for placement and sew one corner border block to each end of the borders from step 4. Sew completed borders to top and bottom of quilt. Press toward borders.



6. Sew a Fabric A $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $92\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to both sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders. Sew a Fabric A $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $84\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top and bottom of the quilt; press.

Finishing:

1. Press backing fabric.
2. Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Baste and quilt as desired.
3. Trim layers even with quilt top.
4. Prepare binding with Fabric F $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Sew binding to quilt using your preferred method.
