
Starbright



"Starbright" is a perfect way to use a multitude of wonderful fabrics for a vibrant, sparkling quilt— the more variety, the more sparkle! Choose three colors: one light, one medium, and one dark. Then select lots of fabrics. Or, strictly go with the three values and mix up the colors. Either will be a shining success.

Fabric requirements

- Background 2-1/2 yards
 (all same fabric) or 14 fat
 quarters for variety
- Diamonds 1/4 yard (all same fabric) or fat quarters or scraps for variety
- Stars 3/4 yard (all same fabric) or six fat quarters for variety
- First border 1/2 yard
- Second Border 1/4 yard
- Third Border 7/8 yard
- Backing 3-3/4 yard
- •Binding 3/4 yard

Approximate size 58-1/2" by 74 1/2"

Cut

- Background cut 144 squares 4-1/2" x 4-1/2", piece A cut 48 squares 2-1/2" x 2-1/2", piece C
 - cut 48 squares 2-7/8" x 2-7/8"; cut these in half diagonally forming 96 triangles, piece D
- Diamonds cut 48 squares 2-1/2" x 2-1/2", piece B
- •Stars cut 48 squares 2-1/2" x 2-1/2", piece E
 - cut 48 squares 2-7/8" x 2-7/8"; cut these in half diagonally forming 96 triangles, piece F
- \bullet First border cut six strips 1-3/4" wide by width of fabric
- ullet Second border cut six strips 1" wide by width of fabric
- ullet Third border cut seven strips 3-3/4" by width of fabric

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Construction

All seams are 1/4 inch


1. On the diagonal, sew piece B to one corner of 48 of piece A. See diagram 1. Trim seam. Press corner open. Set these aside.

2. On the diagonal, sew piece D to piece F, forming 96 half-square triangles. Set these aside.

3. Following diagram 2, make stacks (in their proper place) of pieces C, D/F, and E. Sew together. Make 48 one-quarter star units.






one-quarter star unit

4. Following diagram 3, make stacks of one-quarter star unit, the rest of piece A and piece A/B. Sew these pieces together forming one quarter of the block unit. Make 48 one-quarter block units. (One-quarter star unit finishes at $8" \times 8"$, $8-1/2" \times 8-1/2"$ unfinished.)






one-quarter block unit

5. Following diagram 4, sew four quarter units together to make large block. Make twelve blocks. (Large block unit finishes at $16" \times 16"$, $16-1/2" \times 16-1/2"$ unfinished.)

- 6. Sew large blocks together in four rows of three each. (Quilt center should measure 48-1/2" x 64-1/2".)
- 7. Sew first border to quilt center.
- 8. Sew second border to first border.
- 9. Sew third border to second border.
- 10. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
