



## THE "FOCUS STRIPE" BABY QUILT

This quick and easy baby blanket is the perfect simple sewing project with large print focal fabrics in mind.

## What do you need:

- A: 1/4 Yard: Cut 8 1/2" by WOF
- B: 1/8 Yard: Cut 2 ½" by WOF
- C: 1/8 Yard: Cut 4 ½" by WOF
- D: 1/4 Yard: Cut 8 1/2" by WOF
- E: ¼ Yard: Cut 6 ½" by WOF
- F: 1/8 Yard: Cut 2 ½" by WOF
- G: 1/8 Yard: Cut 4 ½" by WOF
- H: ½ Yard or 1 ¼ Yard of a directional print: Cut 12 ½" by WOF or Trim directional print down to 45" by 12 ½"
- I: 1/8 Yard: Cut 4 ½" by WOF

Backing: 1 ½ Yards Binding: ½ Yard



All Seam allowances are 14°



Choosing your fabrics:

Start by choosing your focal print (H).

Then choose coordinating fabrics that accent the focal print.

It's okay to duplicate a few coordinates.

One note: Stronger colors like yellow, lime green, and orange in the large stripes may stick out more then you want in the final product. If you don't want them to overpower your focal print, use those colors in the smaller stripes (B & F).
















Line up your selvages and sew strips together from A —I.

Make sure your directional prints all face "up" before you sew.

Note: some of your fabrics will be longer then others. Don't worry about that, you will trim those off after you sew everything together.

Press seams open and trim width down to 42".

Quilt as desired and bind.
