
# AJ's Tree

## **SECTION #1**

## **FABRIC AND NOTIONS:**

4- Fat Quarters (Prints #1-4)¾ Yard Background FabricCreative Grids Kaleidoscope or DresdenPlate Triangle Quilt Ruler

### **CUTTING:**

\*Measurements include ¼" seam. You should have enough material to cut extra pieces if you need them.

#### FROM PRINTS #1-4, CUT:

• 2 (5"-wide) strips [See video at 1:00]. From stacked strips, cut 12 triangles using your Kaleidoscope Ruler. Total of 48 Triangles cut. [See video at 3:00].

Note: You will have extras left over, BUT you will only USE the following: Print #1: 10 Triangles, Print #2: 9 Triangles, Print #3: 10 Triangles, and Print #4: 7 Triangles.

#### FROM BACKGROUND FABRIC, CUT:

- 4 (5"-wide) strips [See video at 6:30]. From strips, cut:
  - o 2 (5" x20") Ar and A rectangles.
  - 2 (5" x18") Br and B rectangles.
  - o 2 (5" x16") Cr and C rectangles.
  - o 2 (5" x14") Dr and D rectangles.
  - o 2 (5" x12") Er and E rectangles.
  - o 2 (5" x10") Fr and F rectangles.
- Use your Kaleidoscope ruler to cut each rectangle at the appropriate angle. [See video 8:40]

#### PIECED TRIANGLE STRIP ASSEMBLY:

- 1. Layout 1 Print #1 Triangle, Rectangle Ar and Rectangle A as shown in Figure 1. Join to make row 1 [See video at 17:45].
- 2. Layout 1 Print #2 Triangle, 1 Print #3 Triangle, 1 Print #4 Triangle, Rectangle Br and Rectangle B as shown in Figure 1. Join to make row 2 [See video at 22:30].
- 3. Continue in this manner, using Figure 1 as your guide until you have rows 3-6 pieced.

## TREE BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

1. Join rows 1-6 together to complete the block as shown in Figure 1. [See video at 27:05]

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
