## Zunce

This month we will be making flying geese and adding a border.

## Cutting Instructions

## Light pink:

Cut $4-6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Corner stones.


Cut 36-4" squares. Sub cut each square diagonally in half to produce 72 triangles.


Cut $8-6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles


Light purple: Cut 3-71/4" squares.
Sub cut each square diagonally in both directions to make a total of 12 triangles.


Dark purple: Cut $3-7 \frac{1}{4} / 4$ squares.
Sub cut each square diagonally in both directions to make a total of 12 triangles.


Raspberry: Cut $3-7 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares.
Sub cut each square diagonally both directions to make a total of 12 triangles.


Cut 6 strips 2" $\times$ WOF
These will be sewn together to make two - 2" $\times 60 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips and two - $2^{\prime \prime} \times 571 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

## Sewing Instructions

Flying geese units:
Using the sub cut triangles make 12 light purple units, 12 dark purple units and 12 raspberry units.

1. Sew the light pink (background fabric) triangles to each side of the main fabric triangles.

Press toward background fabric.


2. Square each unit to $6 \frac{1 / 2 "}{} \times 3^{1 / 2 "}$. Making sure to leave a $1 / 4$ " of background fabric from the tip of the main fabric to ensure great points!

3. Sew one of each (dark purple, light purple and then raspberry) flying geese units together. Set and press seams away from points. Make 12. These units measure $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$.


Flying geese border:
4. Make two side borders measuring $45 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ using three flying geese units and two $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Sew together using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press.

5. Make two strips measuring $571^{1 / 2 "}$ using three flying geese units, two $61^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 91^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles and two - $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ corner stones. Sew together using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press.

6. Sew the borders made in step 5 to each side of the quilt. Press.

7. Sew the borders made in step 6 to top and bottom of quilt. Press.


## Raspberry Border

8. Add the raspberry $57 \frac{112 "}{\prime \prime}$ strips to each side of the quilt and the $60 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips to the top and bottom of the quilt.


Our quilt now measures $601 / 2$ " square.
