

Grids Girls 1: Wild and Free Supply List

Ultimate Flying Geese Ruler

Learn how to use the Ultimate Flying Geese Ruler to make 4 at a time flying geese with minimal waste. This ruler can make sizes from ½" x 1" units to 4" x 8" units. Very versatile!!

Pattern: Wild and Free by Camilla Quilts

Fabric Requirements:

Flying Geese Units

(12) – Assorted Prints – 10" square or 1/6 yard or 6" scrap

(12) – Coordinating Solids – 10" square or 1/8 yard or scrap equivalent

Inner Border – 1/8 yard

Outer Border – 1/4 yard

You will make 4 flying geese units from each pair of assorted print + coordinating solids fabrics. The pattern does not call for repeats in fabrics, but you could repeat coordinating solids if you want to. I did twice on my example. I used 12 assorted prints + 10 coordinating solids. You are also not obligated to use coordinating solids if you prefer prints for the sky portion of the units. I would recommend using smaller prints or tone-on-tone fabrics to contrast with the bigger focal prints if you choose not to use solids.

Cutting Requirements:

Please have everything cut out before class. I would recommend treating all flying geese unit fabrics with Best Press or a similar starching agent. We will be sewing on the bias; this will alleviate stretching and distortion.

Flying Geese Units:

From each Assorted Print – (1) 5 ¾" Square

From each Coordinating Solid – (4) 3 ¼" Squares

Inner Border: (3) – 1" strips

Outer Border: (3) – 2 ½" Strips

Basic Sewing Supplies

Sewing Machine in good working condition - table attachment if applicable

Thread

Machine Needles

Fabric Scissors or Snips

Seam Ripper

Straight Pins

Rotary Cutter

Small Cutting Mat – Rotating or Stationary

Fabric Marking Pen

Pen or Pencil & Paper for notes

Best Press

Personal Iron & Mat – Optional

Diagonal Seam Tape – Optional
