## Rick Rack out of whack

A diagonal lattice of rick-rack intersects to form secondary pinwheels in this fun wallhanging. Choose a medium-scale floral for the background and then two high contrast fabrics for the rick-rack.

## Fabric requirements


Yardage is for 42-1/2" wide fabric with 40" of usable fabric

- Background 2-1/4 yards
- Rick-rack intersections (pinwheels) 3/4 yard
- Rest of rick-rack (other triangles) 1/2 yard
- First border 1/2 yard
- Second border 1 yard
- Backing 3-1/2 yards
- Binding 2/3 yard

Cut — Read all directions before cutting

Background — piece A — cut 12 strips 3-1/2" x wof\*, then cut 72 rectangles 3-1/2" x 6-1/2"

- piece F cut two strips 12-1/2"  $\times$  wof, then cut 12 rectangles 12-1/2"  $\times$  6-1/2"
- piece E cut one strip 3-7/8" x wof, then cut
   8 squares 3-7/8" x 3-7/8"; cut these
   squares in half diagonally to form 16
   triangles.







Rick-rack intersections — piece C — cut four strips 3-1/2" x wof, then cut 36 squares 3-1/2" x 3-1/2"

— piece D — cut one strip 3-7/8" x wof, then cut eight squares 3-7/8" x 3-7/8"; cut these squares in half diagonally to form 16 triangles.

Rest of rick-rack — piece B — cut four strips 3-1/2" x wof, then cut 36 squares 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" First border — cut six strips 2" x wof

Second border — cut six strips 4-1/2" x wof wof\* — width of fabric

## Construction — all seams are 1/4"

Read all directions before sewing

- 1. Sew all of piece B to 36 of piece A. See diagram 1. Sew on the diagonal and trim excess leaving a 1/4-inch seam allowance. Press triangle corner open.
- 2. Sew all of piece C to the remaining 36 of piece A. See diagram 2. Sew on the diagonal and trim excess leaving a 1/4-inch seam allowance. Press triangle corner open.

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- 3. Sew these two new rectangles together to make quarter block. See diagram 2. Make 36 quarter blocks. (6-1/2" x 6-1/2", 6" x 6" finished)
- 4. Sew four quarter blocks together to make whole block. See diagram 3. Make nine whole blocks.  $(12-1/2" \times 12-1/2", 12" \times 12"$  finished)
- 5. Sew triangle piece D to triangle piece E to make half-square triangle D/E. Make 16 D/E half-square triangles.
- 6. Sew four half-square triangles D/E together. See diagram 4. Make four small blocks.  $(6-1/2" \times 6-1/2", 6" \times 6"$  finished)
- 7. Sew quilt center together following diagram 5.  $(48-1/2" \times 48-1/2", 48" \times 48"$  finished)
- 8. Cut two strips of first border fabric into four pieces 2" x 20". Sew one small strip on each of the remaining four first border strips. Sew these new, long first border strips on sides of quilt center. Trim ends as needed.
- 9. Cut two strips of second border fabric into four pieces 4-1/2"  $\times$  20". Sew one small strip on each of the remaining four second border strips. Sew these new, long second border strips on sides of quilt center. Trim ends as needed.


