

Beginning Sewing

Master basic sewing skills while learning to use your sewing machine! This 6-part project-based series will teach you the fundamentals of sewing. Once you've completed the series you'll feel comfortable with many projects. Sew for home, sew for baby, sew for you!

May 6 Intro	Feel like sewing terms are a different language? Learn the terms associated with sewing and their meanings. Next we will review just what our sewing machines are capable of doing and look at decorative stitches, as well as identify different feet, and other helpful tools to make exercising your creative side easier
May 20 Pillowcase	Learn to make a pillowcase. Learn to sew a straight line and keep a consistent size seam, use a rotary cutter the purpose of topstitching, and the importance of good pressing skills.
June 3 Fabric Basket	Time to practice what you've already learned while making consistent seams and keeping topstitching even. In this class we'll make a fabric basket. Learn to make a box bottom for your basket, and create texture by crosshatch quilting.
June 17 Zipper Bag	In this class we will be making a zipper bag. Learn to use decorative stitches to create texture, attach an applique, put tabs on a zipper, insert a zipper, and use an overedge stitch to finish your raw edges.
July 1 Tote Bag	Today, we will be making a tote bag. Learn to create pockets, edgestitch binding in place with one seam, attach handles with reinforcement, and create a base insert for a firm base for your bag.
July 15 Wrap Up	To wrap up our basic sewing classes, we will look into reading and understanding patterns, including vital details not to be overlooked. This is your chance to get your questions an-

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Basic Sewing Supplies

- Straight pins
- Seam gauge
- Tape measure
- Fabric marker
- Transparent cutting ruler
- Scissors
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Seam ripper
- Iron and pressing mat
- Walking foot
- Zipper foot
- Overedge foot
- Quarter inch foot
- Wonder clips (optional)
- Point Turner (optional)

Always bring your sewing machine, foot control, power cord, machine manual, basic sewing supplies, and a snack!

Supplies for Project 1 – Pillowcase

- 1-1/4 yd of main fabric (body)
- 1/3 yd of coordinating fabric
- 1/4 yd of coordinating fabric
- Thread to match/complement fabric

Supplies for Project 2 – Fabric Basket

- 1/2 yd of exterior fabric
- 1/2 yd of fabric for lining
- 25" x 16" of In-R-Foam single sided fusible foam
- Thread to match/complement fabric

Supplies for Project 3 – Zipper Bag

- 1/4 yd fabric for Top panels and Zipper tabs
- 1/8 yd fabric for bottom panels
- 1/4 yd fabric for lining
- ¼ yd x 20" or larger batting
- (1) 9" or larger zipper
- Thread to match/complement fabric

Supplies for Project 4 – Tote Bag

- 1 yd of 54" wide medium to heavy fabric (exterior, pocket exterior, and base sleeve)
- 1 yd of quilting cotton (lining and binding)
- 1 yd of 60" SF101 medium weight fusible interfacing
- 3 yd of 1" cotton webbing
- 4x12" plastic canvas
- Thread to match/complement fabric
