## Sergers are for everyone

Often I hear that sergers are just for garment sewists and that quilters have no use for them, but I think they are great for everyone. Yielding a superiorly strong seam that stands up to washing, play, and more a serged seam is great for so much more than just your garments. My favorite way to use a serger as a quilter is for binding. Not only does it secure the binding with a vice like grip, but it compacts the layers of your quilt so your binding lays extra flat and leaves you with a particularly polished look. Additionally if you know your quilt is square you can simply take it right from the quilting to binding process as the serger will trim your excess batting and backing for you. Lately, I've been playing with the Janome HD4BE, a compact 4 thread serger ideal for beginner to advanced sewists. Featuring easy threading, quiet stitching, and boasting up to 1300 stitches per minute this speedy workhorse will become your new favorite tool in your sewing room.
