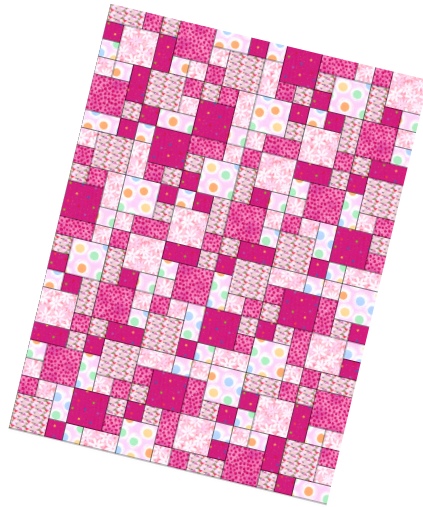


# 5 O'CLOCK QUILT

## 54" x 72"



### Fabric

1 yard of 5 coordinating fabrics

3 1/2 yards backing

### Cutting

From each of the fabrics cut two 6 1/2" strips and four 3 1/2" strips.

From the strips cut the following:

### Fabric A

Ten 6 1/2" squares

Ten 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Twenty eight 3 1/2" squares



### Fabric B

Nine 6 1/2" squares

Ten 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Twenty nine 3 1/2" squares

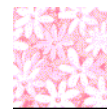


### Fabric C

Nine 6 1/2" squares

Ten 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Twenty nine 3 1/2" squares



### Fabric D

Ten 6 1/2" squares

Nine 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Twenty nine 3 1/2" square



### Fabric E

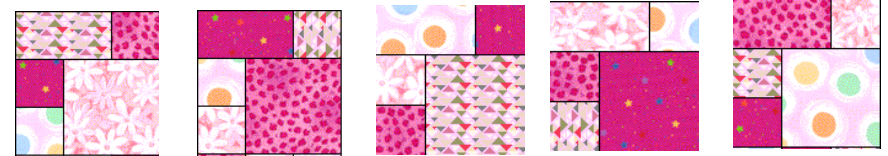
Ten 6 1/2" squares

Nine 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Twenty nine 3 1/2" squares



Sew together the following blocks.



Block 1

Block 2

Block 3

Block 4

Block 5

Make 10

Make 10

Layout 6 blocks by 8 rows. Give some of the blocks a quarter turn to create a more random look. Sew the block together in rows. Then sew the rows to each other.

Quilt and bind as you desire.

Maybe use the left over fabrics for a scrappy binding. Have fun.
