Planning Chair Dusty France called the meeting to order at 6:04 P.M.

Item 1 - Roll Call:

A quorum was present.

Item 2 - Pledge Of Allegiance:

Chair Dusty France led the Commissioner's, Staff and Public in the Pledge Of Allegiance.

<u>Item 3 – Continued Public Hearing: Final Subdivision Plan Review Parcel No. CT-317, 43 Lots – Courtney Richins And Chris Boyer:</u>

Courtney Richins stated they had made a few changes to the subdivision and was here tonight for final approval for Phase I and Phase II. He stated they were looking at developing 30 lots right now. Courtney stated they hadn't drawn in a park, but had reserved a half acre for Phase II if it was decided it was needed and had changed the trail easement. He stated they had met with Summit County and had received verbal approval to have access to cross the river bridge to reach the Fairgrounds. Courtney

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stated they would have gates in the fields that could be opened to have a path to walk on so the kids, etc. wouldn't have to walk on Chalk Creek Road to get to town. Shane McFarland stated the trail easement would be dedicated to the City. Chair Dusty France questioned what Parcel A was. Courtney Richins stated it was the storm detention pond and could be grass with a play area for a park if they decided that was what was wanted. Chair Dusty France stated in his opinion, he didn't think it would work for a playground. Shane McFarland stated it was very common to us an area like this for a playground in a subdivision. He stated this would also be dedicated to the City to maintain. Mayor Trever Johnson stated he had met with Courtney Richins and Tom Fisher with Summit County and was working with them to carve out a piece of land for a playground. He stated Phase II of the County Fairgrounds plan incorporated a playground area, but they didn't plan on building it for another 8-10 years. He stated in the meantime, he had asked the County to designaate an area in Phase I that could be used for a playground. Mayor Johnson stated he felt the location at the Fairgrounds was better than in the subdivision and where the playground should be. He stated Courtney Richins would be willing to put one in the subdivision if needed. Mayor Johnson stated he was confident there would be a playground somewhere, he just wasn't sure of the location. Commissioner Brice Lucas questioned what the access would be for lot #103 and what the lot frontage was for the lots. Courtney Richins stated lot #103 would be accessed off of the lane and not through the subdivision. Shane McFarland stated each lot had 100 feet frontage, but the cul-de-sacs would be a little different. They would have the 100 feet as the lot opened at the setback line. Chair Dusty France stated he would like to have the trail put in or defined now. He stated he was concerned that someone would fence off the trail area as part of their lot. Shane McFarland stated the trail was scheduled for Phase II and there would be an easement showing the trail. He stated all of the infrastructure and improvements would need to be completed or bonded to be able to proceed with the other Phases. Commissioner Linda Vernon questioned who would decide if the trail was asphalt or dirt, etc. Shane stated it would be discussed and the Commissioner's could weigh in on what they would like to have and also what the public had to say about it.

Chair Dusty France opened the public hearing at 6:35 P.M.

Katy LaPay – City Resident

Katy LaPay questioned if there was a Wetland setback required along the Creek. Shane McFarland questioned if she meant the Flood Plain. Katy LaPay stated she meant a Wetland setback as she had to do one when she built her mother a house in Peoa. She stated it may have changed and knew you could build a bridge over it, but you couldn't build a home near it. She suggested for them to check into it. Katy LaPay

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stated she had been in real estate her whole life and one of the ways to let people know about the trail easement and no fencing was to put it in the title report and the subdivision report. She stated the subdivision report would be given to the buyer. It could be spelled out that they could only put a fence so far away and with a certain height. Ms. LaPay stated she didn't think the City Code allowed for a vinyl fence. Niki Sargent stated she would check, but didn't think there was a restriction on the type of material. She stated there were height and setback requirements that would need to be met. Katy LaPay stated she was sure she had to put in a wood fence when they did theirs. She questioned if there would be sidewalks in the subdivision. She stated that was the greatest thing about living where she did on 50 North. There were sidewalks for everyone to walk on. She stated Mrs. Geary was 94 years old and came out and walked on the sidewalk three times a week and all of the kids with young families used the sidewalk and she felt all new subdivisions should have a sidewalk. Shane McFarland stated there would be a five foot sidewalk in the subdivision with a five foot park strip on the main thoroughfares.

Chair Dusty France questioned if they needed to address the issue regarding the wetlands. Shane McFarland stated there wasn't a dedicated Wetland there. Chair France stated there was a recommendation in the Code, Sensitive Lands, regarding streams. Shane stated he would review it.

Tonja Hanson – City Resident

Tonja Hanson stated she understood there wouldn't be another egress until Phase III was developed and stated all of the traffic would be coming out onto Chalk Creek Road. She questioned if anyone had driven up Chalk Creek in the morning and suggested they try it because the sun was in your eyes and you couldn't see. She stated with 20 homes there would be a minimum of 40 cars coming in and out and felt their number one concern should be the safety of the citizens in the area and one egress there was really a problem. She stated she would like them to reconsider allowing that. Ms. Hanson stated she felt they were doing a great job considering the trail space and thanked them for their diligence on making that happen. She stated it would be great to have the Developer put the trail system in before the homes were built so there would be no question where the easement was and where their fencing would be allowed to go. She reminded them again of safety first.

Chair Dusty France questioned if the Council had addressed pushing for two egresses prior to Phase II. Shane McFarland stated he didn't recall them discussing it. Niki Sargent stated they had just followed what the Code allowed which was 30 homes on one egress. She stated they did push for a trail to connect to the Fairgrounds so

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people wouldn't have to walk on Chalk Creek Road. Chair France stated he thought Cody Blonquist requested it. Niki stated he wanted a trail through the other fields to connect to the Fairgrounds so kids wouldn't be walking on Chalk Creek Road. Tonja Hanson stated she thought Councilmember Blonquist's motion required two egresses. Niki Sargent referred to the minutes and had Commissioner Linda Vernon read the motion (Exhibit A). Commissioner Jason Moore stated when it was allowed in the Code they really couldn't do anything about it. Shane McFarland stated they could request the Developer to do it, but they couldn't require them to do it.

Chair Dusty France closed the public hearing at 6:45 P.M.

Shane McFarland referred to the Staff report (Exhibit B) and stated Parcel A was the storm water detention and would have to be developed with Phase I. Chair Dusty France referred to the Code under Title 10 Chapter 2 Sensitive Lands Overlay and referred to the setbacks from the high water mark. The Commissioner's continued to discuss the possible issues with the stream corridor and the setbacks for the lots along Chalk Creek. Shane stated he would review the flood plain and have Sheldon Smith review the Code and the options. Courtney Richins stated he was fine with only receiving approval for Phase I until this issue was resolved. He stated he would need to work in Phase II to install the infrastructure and wanted them to be aware of that, but there wouldn't be any building. Commissioner Brice Lucas stated he would like to have something on paper that would show the kids and people had access through the fields to the Fairgrounds. He questioned if there would be any issues with Lot #103 where the ditch had been abandoned. Shane McFarland stated there wouldn't be an issue because the subdivision had a drainage plan. Mayor Trever Johnson stated there wouldn't be an issue with the City where they had a storm drain plan in place.

A motion was made by Commissioner Jason Moore to approve Phase I of the Chalk Creek Estates Subdivision Final Plan with permission to run the infrastructure work through Phase II with the condition of having written permission on file for the access through the fields to the Summit County Fairgrounds. Commissioner Brice Lucas seconded the motion. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

<u>Item 4 – Review, Discussion, And Possible Approval Of The Summit County</u> Fairgrounds Project Concept Plan – Ron Boyer:

Ron Boyer explained the Fairgrounds Phase I Concept Plan (Exhibit C). He stated Phase I would involve demolishing the Quonset Hut, the small restroom next to it, the bowery, and the livestock barns. They would be replaced with a Community Center and four new barns. Mr. Boyer stated the main use of the facilities was for the Summit County Fair, but they would be available for public use the rest of the year. He stated they were requesting approval for the site plan, drainage, parking, and road. Shane referred to the Staff report (Exhibit D) and stated they had everything in place for preliminary approval. He stated they would be following the same process as anyone else, but this was on a larger scale and the purpose of the City was to make sure it met the intent of setbacks, etc. Mayor Trever Johnson stated from the City standpoint, this was a couple of years work and to keep the mindset of being a partner with the County. He stated the City was happy they were keeping the Fairgrounds here and investing in the City. Comissioner Jason Moore stated he thought it was great and it would be an asset to the City. He thanked the County for investing in Coalville. Chair Dusty France stated he liked that they kept an area for the sledding hill. The Commissioners continued to discuss the amenities and the plans for the Fairgrounds.

A motion was made by Commissioner Brice Lucas to approve the preliminary concept plan for Phase I of the Summit County Fairgrounds. Commissioner Jason Moore seconded the motion. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

Ron Boyer questioned if it would be possible to have a joint public hearing with the City Council on September 11, 2107 for the Phase I Final Plan. He stated they were anxious to get started on the project as they planned to have it completed in time for the Fair in 2018. Shane McFarland stated he thought they would be able to make that happen.

Item 5 - Community Development Updates:

Shane McFarland stated Derek Moss was working on updating the Conditional and Permitted Uses for the Code and would have something for the Commissioners to review soon.

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Shane McFarland stated he would review the Sensitive Lands portion of the Development Code to have the answers available concerning the Chalk Creek Subdivision Phase II area by the creek.

Shane McFarland stated they were still reviewing the Annexation Petition. Chair Dusty France questioned how the Zoning would be handled. He stated some felt the Zone where it connected to the City would continue and others felt it would be Zoned based on the Future Land Use map. Shane stated they were trying to identify the correct way the Zoning would go. He stated there was a 30 day due diligence period and the Zoning was one of the things that needed to be identified. Chair Dusty France stated when the Commissioners completed the Future Land Use Map they didn't identify any Zoning areas. It was just where the border would be. Shane stated he felt it would be prudent for Derek Moss to discuss the Zoning ideas with the Commissioners. The Commissioners continued to discuss the Annexation Petition including Zoning, infrastructure, Pioneer agreements, and services provided.

Commissioner Walter Yates joined the meeting at 7:45.

Commissioner Linda Vernon questioned who would be responsible to put in the irrigation system if the City ended up using Parcel A in the Richins subdivision as a park. Shane McFarland stated Courtney Richins would be responsible to put it in. Commissioner Brice Lucas stated they forgot to question if there would be street lights in the subdivision. Shane stated lighting hadn't been addressed.

Chair Dusty France stated he noticed the Keyes mink shed had been shifted. Shane McFarland stated the Keyes' had excavated the hillside and he had sent a letter to them to tell them to stop work until they had a Geo Tech Engineer review the property and determine if it was safe. They planned to move the shed in sections to the rear of the property. Shane stated he met with them and agreed to let them continue to move the shed and they would have to supply the Geo Tech report to the City. He stated Ben Keyes would like to put three more buildings at the back of the property, but they wouldn't be allowed to move forward until the survey report was finished and they resolved how they would fix the slope they created.

Commissioner Linda Vernon questioned what was happening with the Robertson gym. Shane McFarland stated they had submitted their plans for a building permit and some of the retaining wall was in. He stated the City didn't require a project schedule and had done a lot of work to help them out.

whether it was Commercial or Residential. This was a Residential opportunity where someone wanted to come in and spend some money and do a project through phasing which was smart. Additionally, it was hard for a family; especially a starter family, to be able to find a place that was affordable to build and he felt this was a great opportunity for people and a lot of different demographics to take advantage of. Mayor Johnson stated he loved the layout and expected when talking about trails, they would be able to hammer out a resolution. He stated he had expressed to the Planning Commission that he felt the Council was very pro-trail and that would be part of the discussion for final approval, but for now he felt they should ensure to the builder that they wanted to work with them and recommended they approved this plan. The Mayor and Council continued to discuss the preliminary plan including the trail system, the park area, having 30 homes built before a second egress was added, the possible safety issue of no sidewalk or way to go from there to town, and requiring a minimum of a pathway to town.

A motion was made by Councilmember Cody Blonquist to approve the preliminary subdivision design for CT-317-X following the recommendations from the Planning Commission for a trail and potential park and adding a pedestrian access some way through the neighboring parcel toward town. Councilmember Adrianne Anson seconded the motion. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

<u>Item C – Public Hearing: Review, Discussion, and Possible Approval Of The 2016-2017</u> Budget Amendment and 2017-2018 Budget Resolution 2017-2:

Mayor Trever Johnson stated there weren't any big changes from the tentative budget for the coming year. Tim Rees stated the General Fund usually didn't change much. He stated they had put money in Capital Improvements fund for road projects. He stated they had also budgeted for some employee raises. Tim Rees reviewed the budget (Exhibit E) with the Mayor and Council.

Mayor Trever Johnson opened the public hearing at 8:09 P.M.

There was no public comment.

Decision to be Made: The City Council is the Land Use Authority and is to make the final approval. The planning commission is charged with the decision to either recommend approval, recommend approval with modifications or denial of the proposed preliminary plan. This recommendation is then submitted to the city council.

Approval of the Preliminary Plan by the Planning Commission has been previously granted.

Background: The applicant has submitted an application to subdivide Parcel Number CT-317-X, located at approximately 750 East Chalk Creek Road, Coalville, UT. The existing parcel is 21.02 acres. The purpose of the application is to propose subdividing the existing parcel into 43 parcels, 42 of which are proposed as residential lots, and one parcel (Parcel A) as a storm water retention pond.

The proposed residential lots would range is size from 14,525 sq. ft. (0.33 acres) to 23,039 sq. ft. (0.53 acres). There are currently no existing structures on the property, it is being used as farmland. Access to the proposed subdivision would be via a road constructed from Chalk Creek Road on parcel CT-317-B-X, also owned by the applicant. See notes below regarding corridor preservation in general and access to the subdivision in both the short-term and long-term.

Staff Comments:

- The subdivision is located in an R-2 zone and shall meet the purpose, density, lot size, and frontage requirements of this zone, which are:
 - to provide areas of the community characterized by medium density single family developments;

- density of two (2) lots per acre;
- o minimum lot size of 1/3 acre (14,520 sq. ft.); and,
- lot frontage minimum distance for each residential lot of one hundred (100) feet.
- lots with multiple frontages (e.g. Lot 104) be treated the same as corner lots, which require a setback of twenty (20) feet on ANY lot line adjoining a street, whether as a side or rear yard setback.

project summary

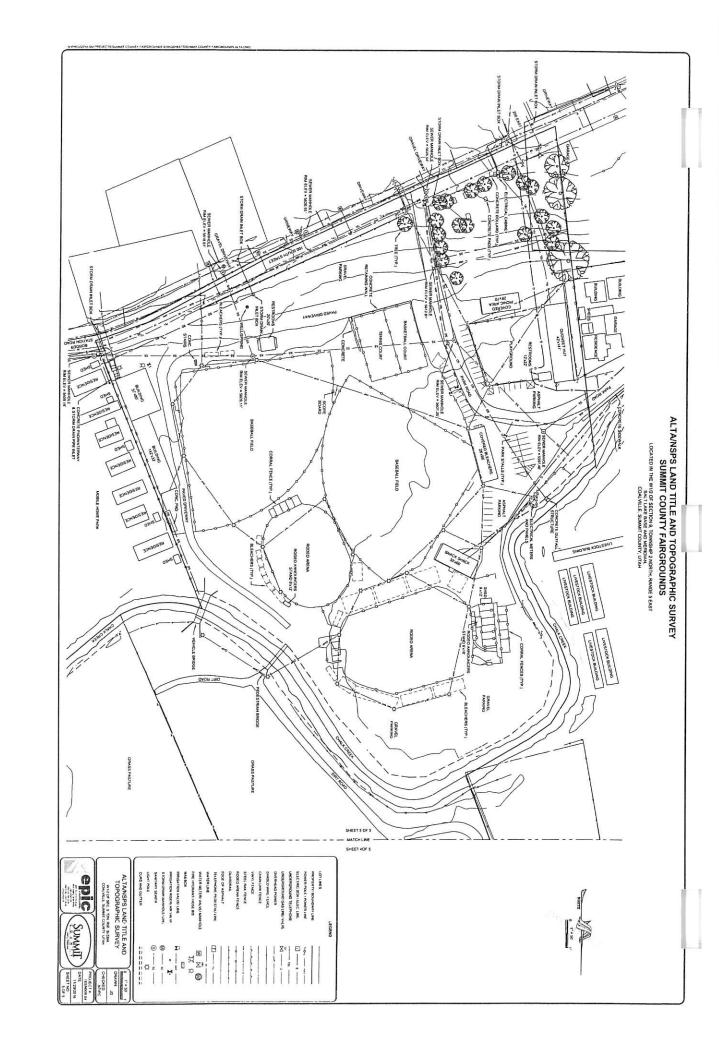
Proposed plan to execute Phase 1 of the Summit County Fairgrounds Master Plan including a new multipurpose Community Center and four new Livestock Holding Buildings. The 11,500 sq. ft. Community Center will be programmed with large flexible meeting spaces, conference rooms, support kitchen, outdoor patios, and public restrooms to support year-round events including the County Fair, weddings, dances, reunions, and retreats. The four livestock buildings will feature one 6,250 sq. ft. enclosed building to be utilized as Fairgrounds storage during the off-season. The remaining three Livestock Buildings (2 @ 6,250 sq. ft. / 1 @ 5,000 sq. ft.) will be open-air pavilions for livestock housing / showing during the week-long Summit County Fair. During non-fair events, these buildings will be utilized as rentable outdoor pavilions for public use.

Facilities requiring demolition include the existing multi-purpose Quonset Hut, adjacent detached restroom building, playground equipment, and picnic pavilion. The Livestock area will require demolition of the existing livestock buildings, and a portion of the adjacent softball / baseball diamond. Current intent to retain working use of the fair-grounds grandstand and primary ball-park, tennis and basketball courts, and rodeo grounds.

Application Information: Summit County (applicant) has submitted a concept plan to demolish and construct phase 1 or the Summit County Fair Grounds.

Applicable Ordinances: Title 8-7

Decision to be Made: The decision to consider approval of the concept plan submitted.

Staff Comments:

A demolition plan has been submitted. A demolition permit will be issued upon application.

The property is located in the Public Facilities Overlay within the R4 zone and the plan meets the area, width, and protection of property setbacks, which are:

- Lot Area: Lot area requirements in the Commercial Zones shall be dictated by off-street parking, adequate
 circulation, and site design requirements. The maximum floor area ratio shall not exceed sixty percent
 (60%) of the lot or parcel.
- Where a commercial development adjoins any residential zone or residential use, there shall be provided along the adjoining property line a six (6) foot solid masonry wall. A wall is not required along the adjoining property line in the required front yard setback.
- Front-Yard Setback: Each structure in the Commercial Zone shall be located at least twenty (20) feet from the edge of any public street, provided however, that no off-street parking shall be located closer than ten (10) feet from any public street.
- Side-Yard Setback: Each structure in the Commercial Zones shall be located at least twelve (12) feet from the nearest building and no less than three (3) feet from the property line.
- Rear-Yard Setback: Each structure in the Commercial Zones shall be located at least twelve (12) feet from the rear property line or adjacent building in order to provide for adequate alleyways for deliveries.

The plan meets parking and driveway approach standards outlined in 10-15-080, which include:

- Have a maximum of one (1) driveway approach for each one hundred (100) feet of public street frontage.
- Said driveway approaches shall be no more than thirty-five (35) feet in width nor less than sixteen (16) feet (for one-way traffic).
- For commercial and industrial uses and apartments with seventeen (17) or more parking spaces, the driveway approach shall be no closer than forty (40) feet to the intersection of two (2) streets.

The applicant will describe the areas planned for landscaping and will provide more detail as to the type and maintenance in the Final Plan. The intent is to meet all landscaping requirements per 10-15-070.

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
