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Help with Hand Applique

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This class is designed to meet YOUR needs, not mine. Many students continue on for a year or more, others take it for just four months. You get to make that decision as you go along. I am there to assist YOU in whatever you need. If it is fabric selection, courage to get started, or merely a word about sharper points—that's what I do. Don't be afraid to ask questions—that's what this class is all about. Have a good time in a stress-free environment.

The class itself is as much a social event as a class. Soon you will get to know the other students and their appliqué projects.

We start off with a quick show and tell, when you share with all of us what you have been working on during the past month. It isn't required that you bring a show and tell; and if you do, it doesn't have to be an appliqué project. During the show and tell portion, the students tell what questions or problems they are having, and I add it to the list of things to cover during that class session. This gives everyone an opportunity to hear what I will be discussing during the class, and they can decide to participate in that "mini-lesson" or not. Usually, the students spend the entire time appliquéing on their project. So come prepared to sew.

With all of that in mind, bring the pattern, book or sketch of the project you intend to work on during class. I will help you get started if that is what you need.

Bring the appropriate fabrics to actually hand appliqué during class.

Bring basic hand sewing supplies, matching thread, etc. to accomplish some appliqué.

If you are interested in trying out new techniques that may be presented from time to time, each month also bring a 12" background fabric and a small assortment of scraps to be used in occasional practice exercises.

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
