

Fabric Basket with Buttons

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Use the template to cut out TWO fabric pieces and and ONE of fusible foam. The foam should be $\frac{3}{8}$ " {1cm} smaller than the fabric on all sides. You can see when its's fused to the fabric that there is seam allowance all around foam.



With right sides together pin the two fabrics together. Leave around a 4 inch gap on one straight side for turning. Sew with a $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{8}$ seam allowance.



After you sew, clip all the corners.



Turn the piece right side out. You will have an opening on one side.



Fold the raw edges in and pin. Top-stitch to close the opening and around the rest of the edge to finish. I sewed very close to the edge.



You can use Velcro, a button or plastic snaps for this step. If you are using snaps, place a snap on each of the outer tabs. The snaps should be in the center of the tab and towards the end. You can fold up the fabric to see where you want to place the snap.





Here is with the snaps on the end of the tabs..



You could also have more overlap and place the snaps further in.



Isn't this fabric basket adorable? It's reversible, useful, and folds down flat for storage.
