

Lattice Embellished Serger Tote Bag Supply List

Serger with cover stitch or serger & sewing machine

If using sewing machine, you could use a triple or double needle for the cover stitch look

¾" Belt loop binder

Clear foot-optional

Cording foot

4 cones serger thread to match fabric

3-4 spools thread to match fabric inset. I used 3 spools Floriani thread to match inset fabric for the cover needles and a coordinating serger cone thread for the cover stitch looper. You will see the thread on the back of the handles.

1 spool fusible thread

1 1/2yds fusible interfacing-Pellon SF 101 or like product

1 yard cording-narrow about 1/8"

Pins a must for lattice work

Wool pressing mat recommended or iron board cover

General sewing supplies: wonder clips, marker-Frixion, ruler, rotary cutter & mat, seam ripper, iron.

Fabric kit or the following fabrics. Please cut and fuse fabrics before class.

1 ¼ yard fabric A: for tote body, straps, lattice strips

1/8 yard fabric B: contrast for insert

1 yard fabric C: lining

Fabric A: Cut:

- 1- 17" X 26 ½" Tote Body
- 1- 3 ¼" x 17" top band
- 2- 5 ½" x 13 1/3" side panel
- 2- 3" x 21" handle straps
- 5- 7/8" x WOF
- 1- 1 ½ x 44" piping

Fabric B:

- 1- 5" x 18" contrasting insert

Using a fixion or water soluble pen and ruler, mark a diagonal grid on the insert fabric, having the lines about 1" apart. I started at the corner of the lower diagonal about 1 inch from the corner using the 45 degree marking on my ruler.

Fabric C:

- 1- 31" x 17" lining
- 2- 5 ½" x 13 ½" lining side panels

Interfacing:

Cut one of each of the pieces above, except the handles straps, lattice and piping strips. Apply to the wrong sides of the pieces according to the manufacturer's instructions.
