

HEXAGON FABRIC TRAY



You can use any size hexagon following the same basic method.

Materials:

- 1 hexagon, from two different print fabrics
- 1 hexagon, cut from quilt batting


Method:

1. Lay the batting down on a flat surface. Position the first fabric right side up and the second fabric right side down. Pin the 3 layers together ensuring all edges and corners are perfectly aligned.
2. Stitch around the perimeter of the hexagon using a 1/4 inch seam allowance. Leave a gap of 1.5 inches in one side for turning. Clip the corners, and turn out the right way through the gap in the lining. Poke out the corners using a bamboo skewer or turning tool. Press.



3. Stitch around the outside of the hexagon using an 1/8 inch seam allowance, enclosing the gap in the lining as you sew.

4. Mark a line that is 1 inch from each outside edge. This will create a smaller hexagon in the center. Stitch along the marked line. Press.



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5. Fold the corners together and secure with a few stitches. You can hand stitch here or I used the button sewing program on my machine. Stitch 3/8 inch in from each point. Press.



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Fill the little trays with little beads or supplies. Don't forget, you can make them in whatever size you like.
