All of our longarm quilting services are completed on our 2 Gammill Optimum longarm machines with one Statler Stitcher. The stitcher offers state of the art stitch and design precision. We have a selection of quilting patterns and designs. One of our specialists will work with you to help you choose the designs and quilting thread that will turn your quilt top into a treasured quilt.

Quilting Categories

Basting - For hand quilters and/or home machine quilters, basting is done in rows approximately 4" apart. Large stitches make it easy to remove once your hand stitching is complete.

Edge-to-Edge - A single pattern is used on the entire quilt top. Many designs are available to enhance or compliment your quilt's design.

Custom - Edge to edge quilting in quilt center with separate design in borders. Also specific placement of patterns in blocks, sashing, borders, and setting triangles.

Binding

You may choose to have us make and attach binding with mitered corners to your quilt by machine so your quilt is ready for you to finish by hand. We also offer binding finishing service so your quilt is completely finished.

The price of quilting your quilt is determined by several factors. The longarm quilting fee is based on the size of the quilt in square inches. For example if your quilt measures 75" x 85" then your quilt is 6375 square inches. If you choose an edge to edge design that is \$.02 per square inch then your fee will be \$95.63 plus cost of batting and binding if desired (see chart for details). Additional charges may apply for specialty fabrics and techniques.

Due to variations in types of batting we require that you purchase your batting from Quilt Etc. There are many choices in fiber content cotton (minimum select loft), poly, wool, silk or cotton/ poly blends.



Fullness Disclaimer - Fullness and/or puckers within a quilt and its borders cannot be quilted out. We can not guarantee that puckers and tucks won't be sewn in. In some cases excessive fullness in borders may result in the quilt corners not being square. The flatter your quilt top is, the better the finished quilt will be.

Mechanical Disclaimer - Please be aware that sewing machines including longarm machines are mechanical devices. Although we do our utmost to ensure perfect results every time, on very rare occasions mechanical problems can occur which may cause minor damage to a quilt to and/or backing.

Quilt Etc.'s Recommended Preparation Checklist


- Quilt top should be trimmed down to final finished size. We do not cut or trim your quilt top.
- Check to be sure all seams are secure. You should stay stitch around your entire quilt to ensure seams do not pull apart.
- Use one safety pin to mark the top of the quilt.
- Remove all excess threads as well as pins, buttons and other embellishments.
- The quilt top should lay flat.
 Measure your quilt top across the top, bottom, and at the center.
 These three measurements should be the same.
 If not, there is a possibility that there will be puckers in your finished quilt.
- Quilt must be clean and free of any odors.
- Quilt top and backing fabric should be completely pressed. All seams should be pressed flat.
- Batting and backing should be at least 6" larger than the quilt top (see diagram) and backing must be square.
- Quilt top and backing should be brought in as separate layers.
- Batting must be purchased from Quilt Etc.
- If you pre-washed the fabrics in your quilt top it is highly recommended that your pre-wash your backing fabric also.



Example: quilt top 60" x 80" batting & backing should measure 66" x 86"
