| Amish Quilting | A style of quilting which draws upon the traditions of Amish communities often using solid jewelTONE COLORS IN EACH BLOCK AND bORDERED AND BACKED IN BLACK FABRIC |
| Applique | A hand or machine quilting method that attaches small pieces of fabric to the surface of a quilt TOP TO FORM A SPECIFIC DESIGN |
| Autograph Quilt | A quilt made of blocks signed by friends and/or family |

| Backing | The fabric used on the bottom of the quilt "SANDWich" |
| Baltimore Album Quilts | A form of quilting popular in the i8oo's employing various applique designs |
| Bargello Quilting | Blocks of color are offset from the next block in such a way as to "rise" or "fall" |
| Basting | A technique which uses long running stitches, pins, or fabric glue to hold the layers of a quilt TOGETHER DURING THE QUILTING PROCESS |
| Batik | A multistep design process which infuses fabric with wax or other substance to prevent dye from penetrating into that area |
| Batting | MAde of cotton, polyester fibers, silk, wool, bamboo or any combination of these fibers, bating is the middle layer of the quilt sandwich, and provides a certain level of "loft" or thickness |
| Bias | A $45^{\circ}$ angle or cut to the lengthwise (warp) and widthwise (weft) threads of the fabric - bias cuts are extremely flexible and most often used for curved applique or quilt binding |
| Binding | A strip of straight or bias fabric sewn and wrapped over the edge of a quilt to finish the raw edges |
| Blindstitch | A type of stitching most often used to attach applique designs to a quilt block |
| Blocks | Smaller units of coordinating fabric pieces and sewn together with other units to form a quilt top |
| Block of the Month (BOM) | One in a series of i2 coordinating blocks and used with il other BOMs to make one quilt |
| Border | A strip of fabric sewn to the perimeter of a quilt top to accentuate the design |

| Calico | A style of fabric design that incorporates a small, repetitive print |
| Charms | Uniform, Precut squares of Coordinating fabric |
| Cheatrr-cloth Quilis | Quilts made from pre-printed fabric |
| Chunky Strips | 4" WIDE PRECUT STRIPS OF COORDINATING FABRIC |


| Corner Setting Triangles | Pieces used to finish quilt rows set on point |

| Crazy Quilt | A randomly designed quilt often created with irregularly shaped scrap fabric |
| Curved Piecing | A technique used in Drunkards Path and other similar block patterns |

| Daisy Chain | A time-Saving method to sew pieces together without backstitching or cutting the threads between each set of pieces |
| Dessert Rolls | 5 " WIDE PRECUT STRIPS OF COORDINATING FABRIC |
| Directional Print | Fabric with a one-way design that has a definite direction or grain or nap |

| Ease | A method used to join two pieces of different lengths in the same seam |
| Еснo Quiliting | Stitching that closely follows the outline of a shape at a consistent distance from the seam |
| English Paper Piecing | A method of hand stitching small pieces of fabric together using paper templates to create a quilt BLOCK |

| Fat Eighth | A piece of fabric measuring approximately im"xi8" (ONe half of a fat quarter) |
| Fat Quarter | A piece of fabric measuring approximately $18^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x} 22^{\prime \prime}$ (ONE half of a half yard cut of fabric which provides more epficient use of fabric than a normal 9 "x 44 " cut |
| Finger Pressing | A technique using your fingers instead of an iron to crease fabric seams or applique edges |
| Finished Block Size | The final size of a completed block once all pieces are sewn together |
| Foundation Piecing | A method of assembling a block by sewing pieces to a foundation of muslin, plain fabric or paper |
| Free Motion Quilting | A type of quilting in which the sewing machine feed dogs are disengaged while quilting with a floating presser foot |
| Freezer Paper Applique | A technique used to create applique templates by ironing the waxy side of freezer paper to the wrong side of the fabric |
| Fusible Stabilizer | A type of support fabric with one adhesive side which is ironed to the wrong side of fabric to help a design maintain its shape |
| Fusible Webbing | A type of support fabric which is sandwiched between two pieces of fabric to "glue" them together |
| Fussy Cut | A technique used to isolate and cut specific fabric images and then appliqued onto the quilt or used as a feature within a quilt block |

| Hand Quilting | A method which uses small uniform running stitches to hold all three layers of a quilt together |
| Hanging Sleeve | A tube of pabric sewn to the back of a quilt allowing it to be hung on a wall or in a display |
| Halp Square Triangle | One half of a 2 Triangle square |
| Honey Buns | $\mathrm{I}-\mathrm{I} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide precut strips of coordinatrd fabric |

| Jeluy Rolls | $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WIDE PRECUT STRIPS OF COORDINATED FABRIC |

| Layer Cakes | Io" FABRIC SQUARES OF COORDINATED FABRIC |
| Lengthwise grain | The longest running thread of the fabric, parallel to the selvedge edge and has the least amount of "GIVE" OR STRETCH |
| Long Arm Quiliting | Quliting accomplished with the use of a long bed quiling machine |

| Marking Pen | A soluble ink fabric pen uskd to mark quilting patterns |
| Mitrred Corner | Vertical and horizontal border fabric joined to create a $45^{\circ}$ angle on the corners of the quilt top |
| Motif | A type of applique design |

| On Point | SQuare blocks that are set in such a way that each Corner points to the top, bottom or sides of the Qulit |
| One Patch Quilts | The design is created by repeating the same patch over and over, then stratrgically placing the fabric in a certain order |

| Pastry Rolls | I2" WIDE Strips of coordinating rabric |
| Patchwork | SImilar to piecing, patchwork consists of putting various fabrics together to create a quilt |
| Pin Basting | A method of using curved safety pins to temporarily hold the layers of a quilt in place while STITCHING THEM TOGETHER |

| Quilt Top | The top layer of a quilt sandwich |
| Quiliting Foot | A presser foot that measures exactly $1 / 4$ " from the point of the nebdle to the seam of the fabric |

| Repeat | The distance between the start of a fabric design and when it starts again |
| Reverse Applique | A technique often used in Polynesian quilting which involves sewing the design to the underside of THE BACKGROUND AND THEN CUTTING AWAY THE TOP LAYER OF FABRIC TO REVEAL THE MOTIF |
| Ruler | A HEAVY, GRIDDED PLASTIC MEASURING GUIDE USED TO CUT VARIOUS FABRIC SHAPES AND WIDTHS |

| SAMPLER | A quilt made of various block patterns, sometimes using different techniques |
| SASHING | STRIPS Of FAbric sewn between blocks to separate one from another |
| Scrap Quilt | A QUILT MADE OF RANDOM COLORS AND PRINTS FROM LEFTOVER FABRIC |
| SEAm Ripper | The tool you love to hate! It is used to remove pesky stitching errors from an otherwise perfect QUILT |
| Selvage | The manufacturer's finished lengthwise edge of the fabric |
| Side Setting Triangles | Used to complete the diagonal rows of on-point quilts |
| Signature Quilt | A QUILT MADE FROM BLOCKS WHICH HAVE BEEN SIGNED BY FAMILY AND/OR FRIENDS |
| Spoonfuls | 8-I/2" FABRIC SQUARES OF COORDINATING FABRIC |
| Stash | A QUILTER'S FABRIC COLLECTION |
| Stippling | Quilting in an irregular path that creates a maze-type stitching pattern |
| Stitch in the Ditch | Stitching in the seam between two different pieces or fabric, Often used when binding a quilt |
| Straight of Grain | Typically associated with the lengthwise grain |
| Straight Set Layout | The result of sewing blocks nest to other blocks without any sashing |
| Strip Piecing | The method of sewing strips of fabric together and then cutting individual pieces |
| Summer Quilt | A Quilt made without batting |
| Sushi Rolls | 2-7/8" sTRIPS OF COORDINATING FABRIC |
| Sweet Rolls | 6" strips of coordinating Fabric |
| Sweet Sixteens | 9 "XII" RECTANGLES EQUAL TO $1 / 16^{\text {TH }}$ Of A YARD |

| T-Shirt Quilt | A Quilt made of old tee-shirts |
| Template | A fixed shape made out of cardboard or plastic used to cut one or multiple pieces of fabric |


| Thangles | Pre-printed paper outlines to create halp-Square triangles |

| Trapunto | A trchniQue created by inserting stupring between the quilting stitches |
| Turnovers | $6^{\prime \prime}$ halp-SQuare triangles of Coordinating fabric |
| Twice the Charm | $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{\prime \prime}$ StRips Of COORDINATING PABRIC |
| Tying | A trchnique which uses a nerdie and yarn or crochet thread to secure all layers of a quilt |

| UnFinished Objects (UFO) | Any project that still isn't done |
| V |  |
| Value | The light and dark contrast in a quilt |
| W |  |
| Walking Foot | A SEWING MACHINE FOOT that feeds both the top and bottom layers of fabric under the needle at the SAME TIME |
| Warp | Made from the lengthwise threads of fabric that extend from the top to the bottom |
| Watrrcolor Qulit | A trchnique using small square of fabric prints to create a subtle and diffused design |
| Weft | Made from the widthwise threads of the fabric that run from selvage to selvage |
| Widthwise grain | Shorter threads of the fabric, running prrpendicular to the selvage edges and has more "give" or Stretch than the lengthwise grain |
| Whole-cloth Quilt | Made from a single piece of fabric with the design being created from the quiling pattrrn |
| Wraps | $7{ }^{\prime \prime}$ SQuAREs of coordinating fabric |
