Class Description:

Learn the basic steps of foundation paper piecing. You will prepare the pattern, paper piece a segment, and join segments together. You will avoid precutting and wasting fabrics. It's a great technique to use your scraps. Essentially, it is sewing by number and sewing a design into a project. You will make a flower to use as a pot holder, in a table runner, or even a quilt.

Supply List:

- Bring your sewing machine with cord, foot pedal and open toe foot.
- The book, Cute & Clever Totes by Mary Hertel. (Purchased from Sew Special Quilts)
- Both paper and fabric scissors
- Add a Quarter ruler (either size)
- Seam ripper
- Rotary cutter with new blade
- Cutting mat
- Glue stick
- Neutral thread
- Pins (flat head pins, preferred)
- 2.5" x 8" or larger ruler
- Seam roller
- New needle
- Iron and pressing mat
- Fat Quarters or scraps for background, petals, stem and leaves, and cone. (The background piece needs to be at least 9" x 11").
