Opening Ceremony--Council Member Andersen gave a thought on being patient and good with each other. Council Member Klinger led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. Approval of Agenda

2. Dan Line- Glen Chaquito Memorial Run –Mr. Line coaches track at Bear River High School. He heard the story of Glen Chaquito who set records in track and he was from Deweyville as an exchange student from New Mexico. Glen was shot at a work site and tried to run away into the desert but was shot again. They want to do a memorial run here at the park. The Leader will set up a go fund me account to build a bridge over the canal so they could run in the foothills. They would want to put it where the walking trail comes to the top. He would need to get easement from the canal company. They need a bridge that is wide enough for 3 people abreast. They would put up a gate to keep vehicles out. The canal road is private, so we would need permission from the property owners. We might need markers to show private land versus public lands. A center post would keep vehicles out. Council Member Klinger will help get a list of landowners. The Council is in agreement with this proposal. Dan Line needs to go to the Canal Company to be sure he has permission.
3. Planning and Zoning – The Commission discussed the Gardner approval for addition, Brent Craven’s fence, and Brad Stevensen is subdividing to sell 5 acres. There was a

discussion of the Oldroyd appeal which the appeal attorney, Duncan Murray decided in the town's favor. The building permit was issued in compliance with our zoning laws.

6. UDOT Culvert Discussion—Clayton Construction will dig for approximately \$6000 which is about \$15 per foot. Grover's estimate for the whole project was over \$30,000. Pipe was donated by UDOT and has to be installed by November 15th. Council Member Klinger has a flatbed to pick up the pipe. Council Member Bingham also has a truck. The UDOT permit for us will be free. The homeowners are all willing to pay to have it installed.
7. Deweyville Fire Station Progress Report—Council Member Bingham has met with the electrician and they are drawing up plans which were not quite ready for tonight. We are putting in gas forced air heaters. Gary Davis of Davis Heating will be installing. Clayton has hooked up water but hasn't turned it on yet. There isn't a meter yet. Council Member Bingham wants to get a couple of bids for electricity supplies.
8. Meet the Candidate Night—This will be on the 17th at 7 pm. It would be nice to have all of the council in attendance.
9. Annual Appreciation Dinner—Dinner will be catered by Iron Gate Grill. The Saturday before Thanksgiving
10. Emergency Management—They met last Tuesday. They will need help digging potatoes. Steve Marble is in charge.

Council Member Reports:

11. Water and Roads (Nathan Spackman)—The new laptop system will use GPS to read the meters. Council Member Spackman talked to Alan Zobrist. He wants to hire him for special projects such as location of meters, location of valves, maintenance etc. He could be water certified. We only have 3 meters that won't read, which is down from 15. We can now drive by and read the meters.
12. Public Info. Ordinance Enforcement, Public Safety (Eric Anderson)—He has drained the water out of the fire truck. When we get the station up, we can refill the truck. We may also have the squad here which is an ambulance that doesn't transport patients. Council Member Andersen will take Mayor Thayne's position on the Fire Council.
13. Park, Walking Trail, Tree Board, P&Z, (Joe Kliger) – He is closing the park.
14. Buildings and Cemetery Maintenance (Todd Bingham)—He took the truck to Bryce to get the door handle fixed. Vandals took the rods so they have to be ordered and it could take some time.
