3. Proposed Approval of Monthly Bills--There was a discussion regarding the Hansen Engineering bill for \$575. 4. Planning and Zoning--There wasn't a meeting this month

New Business

5. Wildland Fire Agreement with the Utah State DNR--see the charts. If a fire roams from Deweyville into the national forest land, we would be responsible to pay all firefighting costs now. They are asking for an in kind payment of \$3400 to change this. This could be weeding and brush cutting which would be paid at \$21.50 per volunteer hour every three years. We would have to track the time and report to them. There was a discussion of things we could do to keep a fire from spreading.
6. Subdivision and Development Engineering Review Fees--There was a review of other towns fees for subdivisions. This will be discussed at the next meeting
7. Possible Changes to the Fees Resolution--There was a discussion of other fees that we may want to change. This will be brought up at our next meeting.
8. Tree Lighting Activity--This will be December 5 at 6:30 pm.

Unfinished Business:

9. Town Appreciation Dinner--This will be on the 19th of November at 6 pm.
10. Deweyville Fire Station--There is a plan for a county wide fire district which may mean there would not be a need for a fire station in Deweyville. If this plan doesn't go through, the normal procedure is that the land and the building for the station is deeded to the district. We might be able to lease both to the District but either way we could not use it for storage.

11. Emergency Management -- There is a meeting Saturday at 9 am. They harvested five tons of potatoes. A gentleman from Perry donated 4 new army style canvas tents. They had a target practice.

Council Member Reports:

12. Water and Roads (Nathan Spackman)--The State code as of May 2016 suggests we increase our water rates. We currently meet the state law. The new law would raise the rate for overages to \$ 0.50 per gallon over 25,000.

13. Documentation, Public Info. Ordinance Enforcement (Eric Anderson)--There is a mineral lease grant for which he has applied to purchase supplies. They have about \$25,000 to spend. The fire truck has been drained for winter.

14. Park, Walking Trail, Tree Board P&Z, (Joe Kliger)--Leaves are an issue. The mower doesn't bag.

15. Buildings and Cemetery Maintenance (Todd Bingham)--nothing to report
