6. Tom Christensen Annexation Application --Mr. Christensen has talked to UDOT. He is giving the town an easement to the cemetery that needs to be recorded with the county. Council Member Spackman

brought up that the town needs to produce an easement through the property for the water lines. Council Member Kliger suggested that we compare the benefits of two new building lots versus the town purchasing the lots for the cemetery. He will look into the history of the property and the costs.

7. Planning Commission Zoning Ordinance Changes—Lots will still need 125 ft frontage for ½ acre lots. The Health department requires ½ acre lot. Mayor Thayne wants to put this item in the newsletter and let the town vote.
