7. Culvert and Flooding Management UDOT Information-- The UDOT letter said there would no help from them because there was no benefit to the state. 8. Deweyville Fire Station Update--The plans are now in the County Attorney's hands. They want to draft an agreement that would stipulate that if the Fire District ever dissolves, the County would be paid back their portion of the cost which is 40% of total cost. The start date for building will be in April. We have people who want to help. We have contractors ready to go.
9. Emergency Management--There is a meeting Saturday at 9 am. There is a radio call Sunday at 8 pm. Saturday they are going to remove the sand bags to storage.

10. Water and Roads (Nathan Spackman)--The Water conference was great. He is looking at tiered water rates. He will be updating the meter readers. He will be looking at new billing software. There is a video by Brian McIlheney from NOAA on the Box Elder Flooding that everyone should view.
