New Business:

5. Jack Williams, Keith Young, Kim Richins to discuss Oldroyd property and what is allowed in residential areas--They would like reassurance from the Council that Mr.Oldroyd is not being approved to run a commercial business. Mr. Williams talked to Mr.Oldroyd and had the impression that he would be employing several people in a cabinet shop. When Mr. Oldroyd presented to Planning Commission that it would be a personal shop for himself to finish cabinet doors. Council member Spackman said it would be allowed to have a home based business that did not affect noise or dust levels. A home based business must be conducted within 1500 sq ft. Mr. Williams is concerned that a commercial business will pull their home values down. Mr. Williams is questioning if the location is correct, and what the size of business. Council needs to hear from Mr. Oldroyd. They were thanked for their concerns and the Council will investigate.
6. Discussion and possible adopting of COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT with UDOT--UDOT will provide the pipe but it will be up to the homeowner to install. It is between mile marker 7 and 13. It is enough to do short areas. The town will provide the labor.
