1. Approval of Agenda

2. Approval of June 9, 2016 Council Meeting Minutes

3. Proposed Approval of Monthly Bills--there was a discussion of the bills. Andrew Taylor charged mileage for using his truck for park errands. Council Member Kliger approved because the tires on the town truck are worn down and need to be replaced. The Mayor said the cost for new tires will be split between water and cemetery. Mayor Thayne will talk to Council Member Bingham about getting the tires replaced.

4. Planning and Zoning--The latest minutes were discussed. The Vallencourts questioned the procedures to follow. Mayor Thayne and Council Member Kliger explained the ordinances to them.

**New Business:**

5. Cross Connection Control Policy--There was a discussion of the handout showing the new policy for our drinking water. Council Member Spackman recommends that we pass this new policy. Mayor Thayne said we have to have a policy in place. He recognizes that it is a hard policy to enforce but we need the policy in place and to let people know we have it. This is not an ordinance but a policy. Council Member Kliger feels we already have this in our water ordinance and do not need a separate policy.

**Council Member Andersen moved to adopt the Cross Connection Control Policy and Mayor Thayne seconded the motion. This passes by 2/3 vote.**

6. Fire Restriction Resolution #7-16-01--The County has adopted a similar resolution and they are recommending that we do it on the town level as well. This resolution is binding but is not law in court. This is intended to prohibit fireworks in fields and hill sides. The fire season, this year, is from June to October but is based on weather conditions and could change from time to time. Council Member Kliger suggested we post this on our website and in the newsletter.
