5. Deweyville Fire Station—There was a discussion of the proposed building quote. The cost of 6 “ of concrete would be about \$2,640.00 for the 30x40x14 building. Council Member Andersen has another bid for the building for \$2000 less but it is not installed. The cost would be about \$30,000 for concrete, electrical etc. There was a discussion about whether Deweyville should own the building or let the fire district own it. Who is paying for utilities and maintenance. Should it be our building if we are paying those costs. Control of how the building is used is the issue. The matter is up for discussion when there are more facts available.
6. South Spring Collection Area Development—Council Member Bingham was up at the spring last night and the cap was not locked and water is still flowing into the reservoir and it should be locked at all times. Most of the water is turned off but some is still flowing. They are digging down 6-8 ft then visqueen will be put over it with gravel in several layers. They are going to dig north. There are 3 collection areas. And they will put in new pipe to collect this water. Hopefully this part of the project will be done in 10 days. We need to build a gate.
