Begin your knitting journey with this fashionable cowl or a pair of fingerless mitts designed to introduce you to the basics of knitting. You will learn how to cast on, the knit stitch, the purl stitch, and how to bind off. You will also learn how to make simple buttonholes.

Tool Box Classes

Project Classes

Project classes allow you work on a project with expert instruction. Each class will incorporate different skills that you will be taught. Project classes are generally between two and five sessions long, and each session is 2-hours.

Batad (knit) with Jane

Batad is a Stephen West statement piece! Make this fun poncho/cowl with Jane. You will learn a few new skills while knitting in versatile garter stitch. Choose two colors of color-changing yarn for a cool effect!

Skills taught in this class:

- Provisional cast on
- Short row shaping
- Yarnovers

Pattern: *Batad* by Stephen West (\$6.00; Ravelry In-Store Download)

Yarn: fingering weight yarn – 2 colors, approximately 420 yards ea

Needles: US 4/3.5mm 32" circular and 40% circular *or size to obtain gauge*

Blurre (crochet) with Shelley

Want to crochet your fade? Create the perfect transition of color in this crescent-shaped shawl. Clever color placement creates a gradual blurring of the lines between each colorway so there is a gradual transition from one color to the next. Make your Blurre as calm or as dramatic as you wish. Blurre uses 5-6 colors of fingering weight yarn (see quantities below). Pull from your stash and have us help you supplement with yarns from 3 Kittens. Some time will be reserved in the first class to help you finalize your colors, but there may not be time to start color selection, so please bring some choices.

Skills taught in this class:

- Crochet increases
- Slip stitches
- Fade color selection

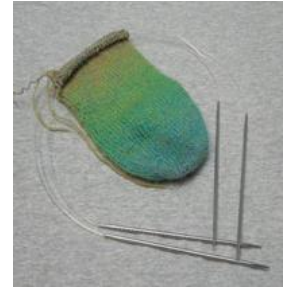
Pattern: *Blurre* by Deanne Ramsay (\$6.00; Ravelry In-Store Download)

Yarn: fingering weight yarn – 5-6 colors

Hook: US 7/4.5mm, US H/5.0mm

Toe Up Socks on 2 Circs (knit) with Jane

Bring all of your basic socks skills here, and you will learn how to cast on at the toe and work your way up past the heel to bind off at the cuff. This technique allows you to knit the cuff as long as you want - or until the yarn runs out!



Skills taught in this class:

- Emily Ocker's Magic Ring Cast On
- How to knit in the round with two circular needles
- Jeny's Surprisingly Stretchy Bind Off

Knit-A-Longs

Knit-a-Longs (KALs) are social stitching times where everyone works on the same project. There is no instruction, so technically, Knit-a-Longs are not really classes; however, there is a staff host that can provide some guidance. Knit-a-Longs run approximately 6-10 weeks depending on the project.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do I register?

Registration is easy – stop in to register in person or call us at 651-457-4969 or go to our website at www.3kittensneedlearts.com.

Q: What should I bring to class?

Bring any tools you might need – scissors, tape measure, tapestry needle, paper, pencil, stitch markers or stitch holders, etc. We call this your “knit kit” or your “crochet kit”. And, bring your enthusiasm!

Q: Can I get help between classes?

We are always here to help you! Your instructor will let you know what hours she typically works in the store and if she teaches any of our studio classes. Plus, our staff is very knowledgeable and is willing to help! If you need more than just a little help, we can always set up a private coaching session (\$25/hour) with your regular instructor.

Q: What is “pre-work”?

Pre-work or homework is simply something that you need to do prior to the first class. Generally, it will involve knitting gauge swatches or knitting samples to work on in class; however, sometimes it includes watching videos or doing some reading before class begins. Please make sure to do all pre-work/homework in order to make sure your learning experience and that of the other students is the best it can be!

Q: What do the Skill Levels mean in the class descriptions?
