Supplies to bring to class:

Pattern: Rita's Satchel pattern (\$25 payable to Jan in class)

Fabrics:

1 yard outer fabric

1 yard lining

½ yard binding

1 yard cotton batting

4" x 4" piece of wool (optional for monogramming)

Notions:

- 8 count of 1" Easy-Snap Together curtain grommets by Dritz Home (No Tools Required!) black, satin nickel, gold, champagne, and bronze
- 8 Sticky Back for Fabric Velcro 1" x ¾" ovals (Peel & Stick for a Permanent Bond)
- 2-2/3 yards of 3/8" basic trim cording without lip (home dec embellishment)
- Thread to match fabrics
- #90 Universal needles
- pins
- 4" sharp bladed scissors for cutting quilted fabric
- paper scissors
- 3/8" Wonder Clips by Clover
- 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" ruler
- Sewing machine in good working order with capability of using a straight stitch and a zigzag stitch
- Walking or even-feed foot for sewing machine (optional, but handy)

PRIOR TO CLASS, PLEASE PREPARE THE FOLLOWING!!! THERE WILL BE NO TIME ALLOTTED IN CLASS FOR DOING THIS PREP WORK!!!

1. Sandwich the batting between the outer fabric and the lining, with both the outer fabric and lining facing right side out.
2. Spray baste all three pieces together and quilt as desired. A 1" cross-hatch would work great or a simple meandering.
3. From the Quilted Fabric, cut the following pieces:
 - 4 – 10" x 15" pieces for the sides of the bag
 - 4 – 10" x 10" pieces for the inside pockets
 - 2 – 7" x 7" pieces for the pincushion
4. From the Binding Fabric, cut:
 - 2" x width of fabric **BIAS** strips. Join together to make **200" of bias binding**.
 - Roll the 200" of the bias binding onto an empty paper towel or toilet paper cardboard roll and bring to class.

Please be sure to bring all of the above with you to class.
