

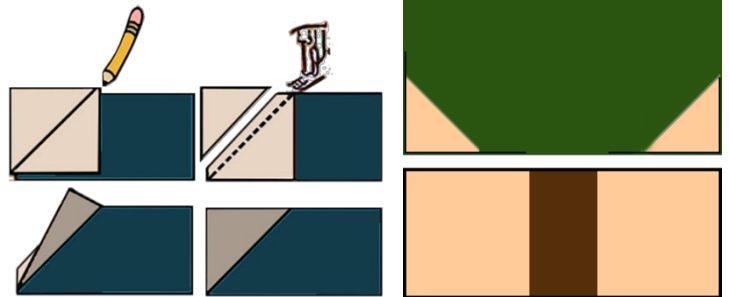
# How to make an Apple/Plain Tree or a Tri-Recs/V-Block Pine Tree for the Pieceful Village Quilt

## For the Apple or Plain Tree you will need:

- (1) 5 ½” x 4 ½” rectangle of green fabric for the tree
- (4) 1 ½” squares of cream background fabric
- (2) 2 ½” x 3” rectangles of cream background fabric
- (1) 1 ½” x 3” rectangle of brown fabric for the trunk of the tree
- Red fabric if you want to add apples.

### Instructions:

Use the 1 ½” squares of background fabric and your tree fabric to make the top of the tree. Sew a cream rectangle on either side of the brown trunk triangle to make the bottom of the block. Block should measure 5 ½” x 7” at this point.



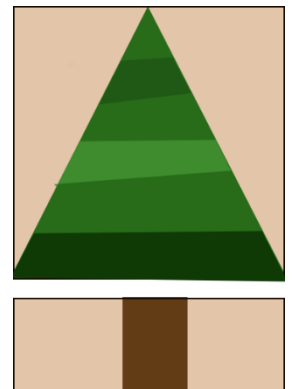
To add apples, I used Heat and Bond Ultra to make fusible apples, using a dime for size. You may choose to use your favorite applique method.

## For the Tri-Recs or V-Block Tree you will need:

- (1) 5 ½” – 6” strip of green. I constructed mine out of several strips of different fabrics. Trim strip to 5 ½” for Tri-Recs or 6” if you are using the V-Block Ruler.
- (1) 5 ½” or 6” strip of cream background fabric
- (2) 2 ½” x 2” rectangles of cream background fabric
- (1) 1 ½” x 2” rectangle of brown fabric for the trunk of the tree

### Instructions:

Follow the instructions for your chosen ruler to cut 1 or more Tri/V units from your strip of green and an equal number of pairs of Recs/half rects units from your cream strips. Remember to cut your squares Right Sides Together so that you will have mirror image units. Construct a 5 ½” (5” finished) Tri Recs/V-Block Square.



Sew a 2 ½” x 2” rectangles of cream to either side of the 1 ½” x 2” rectangle of brown fabric for the trunk. Sew the block together. Block should measure 5 ½” x 7” at this point.
