#### About this trip

Ready for an adventure? Next fall, Longmont Yarn Shoppe and Rowan Tree Travel & Fibercraft are taking you on an 11 day/10 night, fiber-infused trip to the land of frost and fire: Iceland! Our group of creative travelers will explore the country's wool and textile traditions, distinctive foods, contemporary culture and dramatic landscape. We'll start in the capital city, Reykjavik, then fly over Iceland's mountainous interior to the far north coast. From there, we'll drive down Iceland's west coast to its verdant southlands. Along the way, we'll stay in comfy, contemporary inns and hotels. We'll visit glaciers, fiber folks and fjords, learn about turf homes and the history of Iceland's settlement, soak in geothermal pools here and there and enjoy some fine, farm-to-table meals. Here's a special bonus for the trip: Our group will be in Iceland during the South Iceland Wool Week festival. We couldn't have timed this tour better! During this transitional season from endless summer days to dark winter



evenings might we see northern lights? Might we come to love *skyr*, rye bread and *kjötsupa*? Will we be able to fit an Icelandic lamb in the mini-coach to bring with us? Come along and find out!

#### Day 1 Thursday, September 26

#### Reykjanes Peninsula

Welcome to Iceland! No need to arrive early for this tour – our first day is tailor-made for scooping you up, showing you some sights while still jet-lagged and then settling you in for a soft landing at our Reykjavik Hotel. We'll meet everyone at Iceland's International Airport in Keflavik. Once together, we're headed for a beautiful morning of soaking at the famous Blue Lagoon. Hot water and good food will get all the kinks out! By the afternoon, we'll drive north to check in at our city-center hotel in Reykjavik. The location means we can have a nice walk around to get oriented, pop into the Icelandic Handknitting Association's shop and then find some dinner (or head right to bed, your choice). For a special hello to Reykjavik before bed, hop in the elevator and go right to the top floor. We have a spectacular view of the city lights!



#### Day 2 Friday, September 27

#### Reykjavik

After breakfast, we'll gather for a ramble around Reykjavik. Our local guide, Anna, will tell you about the city's rich history and contemporary culture plus add her own observations as a longtime resident. You'll get to know the shopping, business, waterfront and neighborhood districts before arriving for our visit at the National Museum of Iceland. Dinner together will be at one of our favorite restaurants in Reykjavik! And after, perhaps a drink or some hot tea and knitting at the top of our hotel?????





#### Day 3 Saturday, September 28

#### Husavik

Take the morning to have a wander along Reykjavik's shopping streets or the waterfront sculpture walk. By midday, we'll be checked out from our hotel and on our way to a knitting workshop in traditional Icelandic tassel hats with Þórdís Halla Sigmarsdóttir and Guðný María Höskuldsdóttir (but you can call them Thordis and Guthny). Once our heads are well appointed with our own handcrafting, we're getting on a flight to the north coast of Iceland! Our plane will travel over Iceland's mountainous interior and land us in the capital of the north, Akureyri. It's a short drive over to Husavik, a tiny but sweet village perched on the edge of Skjalfandi Floi (Shaky Bay) and famous for its wildlife, especially whales. (Anyone recognize the town's name from the movie *Eurovision Song Contest: The Story of Fire Saga* with Will Ferrell and Rachel McAdams?)



#### Day 4 Sunday, September 28

#### Iceland's North Coast

This morning we'll get to know Husavik's most famous residents: whales of the North Sea. Though the town is small, it hosts a world class museum that will teach us a great deal about these behemoths. Then we'll have time to visit the small shops and restaurants, shop for yarn and *plutolopi* in the hardware store (really!) and have a look in the beautiful wooden church, Húsavíkurkirkja. Then we're off for a truly fabulous soak at GeoSea, where the cliffside seawater pools are warmed by geothermal activity. If the weather is just right, we'll get to enjoy a beautiful view across Skjalfandi Floi to the snow-covered Viknafjoll and Kinnarfjoll





mountains and catch a sunset while relaxing in the pools.

#### Day 5 Monday, September 30

#### **Iceland's North Coast**

We'll depart from Husavik early in order to watch the morning light as it plays across Godafoss, a spectacular waterfall along the north coast of Iceland. We continue on to Akureyri for a very special activity involving Iceland's fabled "Hidden People"! In the afternoon, we'll visit a fantastic local yarn shop and have lunch with its owners, hearing about their experiences with the fiber community in Iceland's far north. We'll also visit a traditional Icelandic turf house to get a first-hand look at the way Icelanders lived, farmed and survived the harsh conditions of the 17th to 19th century. Then we'll enjoy dinner and a night's stay at one of our favorite Icelandic guesthouses. The views along the valley, mountains and out toward Skagafjordur are not to be missed!



#### Day 6 Tuesday, October 1

#### **Iceland's North Coast**

This morning, something a bit different! We're all aware of Icelandic sheep and the beautiful, hard-wearing wool gathered from the country's flocks each year. But did you know there is also an Icelandic breed of goat? This breed lives only in Iceland and was almost extinct as recently as a decade ago. The Icelandic goat's undercoat is super soft and fine enough to qualify as cashmere! We'll visit the home and studio of a north Iceland goat keeper and get to know more about





these fantastic animals, plus taste some of the farm's culinary produce and fondle some cashmere yarn. (Yes, we can also purchase.) Next we're off for a specially hosted tour of the Icelandic Textile Museum in the town of Blonduos. Our day ends with a soft landing at our west Iceland hotel where a beautiful dinner awaits!

#### Day 7 Wednesday, October 2

#### Langjökull Glacier

When in Iceland, it's important to encounter, well... some ice! We'll do that with a visit up onto the Langjökull glacier. Our visit to the ice cave up there is a fantastic, highly educational experience – a full day event and true highlight of the tour. Once we get down off the mountain, we'll enjoy a good hot soak in our hotel's hot pools before another great Icelandic farm-to-table (or should we say greenhouse-to-table) dinner.



#### Day 8 Thursday, October 3

#### **Iceland's West Coast**

Today we travel from the west coast of Iceland to the south. We'll stop at some of Rowan Tree's favorite sites including Thingvellir National Park, the location of Iceland's historic Althingi (the world's earliest parliament). Thingvellir is also the rare site where we can see geology happening in real time: the North American and Eurasion tectonic plates are pulling apart here at the rate of an inch per year, creating the Thingvellir Rift Valley. We'll land for our final three-night stay at the most luxurious of our Icelandic accommodations. Enjoy!





#### Day 9 Friday, October 4

#### Ullarvikan a Sudurlandi 2024

(South Iceland Wool Week)

As we've traveled down from the north, the 2024 South Iceland Wool Week has been going on in and around the town of Selfoss.

Depending on the festival's schedule, we'll join in for today's farm visits, demonstrations and other events of interest OR enjoy some exploration around Iceland's beautiful southern coast. Lots to explore here!



#### Day 10 Saturday, October 5

#### Ullarvikan a Sudurlandi 2024

(South Iceland Wool Week)

Hooray! Today is the South Iceland Wool Week Makers Market! The sheep keepers, dyers and crafters of the region gather to show off their wares – and we'll be there to peruse, join in the cake & coffee discussions and purchase goodies to our hearts' content. It's a great way to wrap up our time in Iceland. Then we'll enjoy a final, celebratory dinner together at the hotel's exquisite restaurant.





#### Day 11 Sunday, October 6

#### **Homeward Bound**

After a hearty breakfast, we'll load up the bus with all our luggage and acquired goodies and head over to Keflavik International Airport (about an hour and a half away) for flights home.



#### Your Fiber Ambassador Anna Toher
