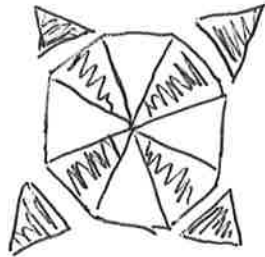


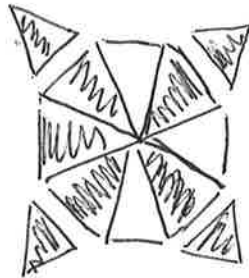
## Scrapology Challenge Part 4

I hope you have enjoyed the Scrap Challenge so far. This month you are going to start to put together the blocks. There will be 3 different blocks to assemble from the light/dark sets and the dark/dark sets of triangles.

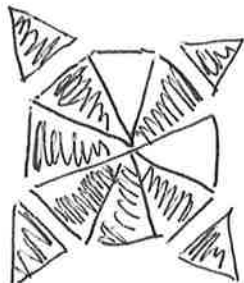
1. Center blocks are made using the light/dark sets. It will take 4 sets to make the block. Make  $\frac{1}{2}$  block units as instructed in the video. You will be pressing your blocks counter-clock wise and pressing the center bulky part of your seam open to look like a 4 patch. Lap Size=15 blocks, Large Size=35, Queen size=48



2. Border blocks are made using 3 sets of light/dark and 1 set of dark/dark. Make  $\frac{1}{2}$  block units as instructed in the video. You will be pressing your blocks counter-clock wise and pressing the center bulky part of your seam open to look like a 4 patch. Lap Size=16 blocks, Large Size=24, Queen size=28



3. Corner Blocks are made with 2 sets of light/dark and 2 sets of dark/dark. Make  $\frac{1}{2}$  block units as instructed in the video. You will be pressing your blocks counter-clock wise and pressing the center bulky part of your seam open to look like a 4 patch. Make 4 blocks



4. Now to add your corners to the blocks you created in the first 3 steps. Reminder, these half square triangles are over-sized so the block can be trimmed. (This is where I mentioned that the 4 ½" or 4 ¼" squares cross cut into triangles would work) You will need 4 half square triangles per block. Roughly center the half square triangle on the appropriate triangle according the drawn images above. Press the seams to the outside. Square the blocks to 9 ½"
  
5. Lay out your blocks for placement. I recommend laying out the center blocks first. Now place your outside border blocks. Hint-the dark colors to the block will be on the outside edge. The corner blocks finish off the border blocks. Again the dark colors to the block will be on the outside edge.
  
6. Piece your blocks to form rows together, press seams in each row in the opposite direction so you can lock your seams when sewing the rows together. Press. You decide if you want to add a border or just quilt and bind. Enjoy!
