

**Layer Each Colored  
Fabric Right (or  
Wrong) Sides  
Together with an  
Equal Amount of  
Background(s). Cut  
Two 5-1/2" Strips  
from Each Across the  
10" Side.**



**Fold a “Pair” of 5-1/2”  
Strips (Background &  
Color) in Half & Cut  
Apart. This Makes  
Four Squares of Each  
Color that are  
Approximately 5-1/2”.  
No Need to Trim  
Precisely at this Point.**



**Measure 1-1/2" From the Right Edge.**


**Use a 45-Degree Kaleidoscope Ruler to Slice the Stack in Half.**

**This Results in Stacks of Mirror Image Pairs.**





**Use a 45-Degree Kaleidoscope Ruler to Cut Four Triangles From Each 3-1/2" Strip (Both Background & Colors). Rotate the Ruler as You Cut.**






**Align the Wide Base of  
a Triangle with the  
Narrow End of an  
“Opposite” Wedge.  
Overlap at the Top is  
Normal. Sew Together.  
Press Away From the  
Center**





**Repeat the Process with the Remaining Matching Wedge. Align the Wide Base of a Triangle with the Narrow End of an “Opposite” Wedge. Overlap at the Top is Normal. Make at Least 16 Sets**




**Center Each Sewn Unit in a 3-1/2" Square. Trim. There Should be a Margin of Background Fabric at the Peak of the Triangle. You May Also Have to Trim the Bottom of the Triangles. Repeat for All Color/Background Combos.**



**Pick a Pleasing  
Layout.**



**Join the Triangles in  
Sets of Two.**



**Then Make Four-Patches**





**Join the  
Pieced Units  
Together Like  
a 4-Patch.**
