

## Events and Recreation

Lindon sponsors several community events and activities throughout the year, including an annual week-long fair, youth sports programs, Christmas tree lighting celebration, and more. With over 50 acres of park space and quick access to skiing at Sundance or boating on Utah Lake, Lindon is a perfect place for any outdoor enthusiast. The City has been active in building new parks, trails, and recreation facilities – including the 2009 completion of a \$10 million dollar public aquatics facility in the heart of the community.



## Shopping, Schools, and Family

Access to multiple shopping, dining, and grocery stores abound in and around Lindon. Regional malls and movie theaters are minutes from town with every national chain imaginable found within the city or just a short drive away.



The City is within the Alpine School District which operates a Jr. High and two elementary schools within Lindon. Two High Schools are 5 and 10 minutes away. There are also three charter schools within the city and two major universities, Brigham Young University and Utah Valley University, within 20 minutes of town.


Lindon has a young population with a median age of 22 years old. It is a family friendly community that strives to accommodate needs of both young and old. While the pool and playgrounds may be oriented towards youth within the city, Lindon is also conscious of its' aging population and is working to construct a new senior center anticipated for completion in 2011.

Health care resources are readily available as instant care facilities are within the community and three full-service regional hospitals are within 5, 10, and 20 minutes.


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

Lindon City has a smaller population of about 10,750 and is known for being a 'little bit of country' in the midst of rapid growth. Our community is situated in the center of a major urban area approximately 45 minutes south of Salt Lake City. Lindon has all varieties of goods and services readily available, including a full-time police and fire department. **Within Utah County there are over 500,000 people with the population estimated to double by 2030.** Lindon is bisected by I-15 with easy freeway access at two interchanges. The City currently has over 600 active business licenses with hundreds of additional acres available for development along our 700 North Corridor (see map at right). There is access to a highly educated workforce available from two major universities within 20 minutes of the City. Lindon is an active member of the Utah Valley Chamber of Commerce and is also a partnering member of UTOPIA – establishing an extensive fiber optic network throughout the city. In 2009 the city was honored when CNN Money Magazine ranked Lindon as one of the "100 Best Small Cities to Live in America". Find out more about Lindon by visiting our web page.
