Improving Utility Infrastructure & Services

Over the last couple years Lindon City has made significant strides to improve its utility infrastructure and utility services provided to residents and businesses. We remember too well the boil order that occurred during Christmas of 2016 and we dread the next sewer line back-up, storm water flooding or water main break - which all unfortunately occur from time-to-time. Here's some highlights of utility infrastructure & service improvements.

Drinking Water: Lindon has improved its drinking water infrastructure through installation of chlorination systems at our wells. We're working to install remotely monitored water sampling stations for 24/7 ability to verify appropriate chlorine levels, which ensures drinking water is free from harmful bacteria. Water storage tanks have also been re-inspected and cleaned. Pictured to the right is a new chlorination system in one of our culinary well houses. Additional security measures have been put in place to help protect equipment, tanks and water facilities. Our Public Works Department and Building Official have been instrumental in getting our facilities updated and improving drinking water infrastructure.



Sewage (Waste Water) Disposal: The City recently completed a new sewer lift station (pictured at left) that has been constructed to serve approximately 1/3 of Lindon's build-out population. Constructed in conjunction with the Ivory Homes 'Anderson Farms' residential development on the west side of Lindon, this facility will combine sewer flows from three older lift stations thus eliminating need to maintain and rebuild the other lift stations.

Consolidating sewer flows into this primary facility will save millions of dollars in the future and allow for easier maintenance and system redundancy. Waste water employees are working to increase the frequency of cleaning and inspecting sewer main lines and man holes to help prevent back-ups and better maintain Lindon's sewer system. |



Storm water: Lindon is finalizing an updated Storm Water Master Plan that will guide installation of future storm water infrastructure to help alleviate flooding. Our Storm Water employees also work hard to keep streets, inlets, and ditches cleaned and construction sites regularly inspected. Unfortunately, Mother Nature will at times exceed our drainage capacity but an updated plan and future improvements should prevent the majority of storm water flooding.

Lindon has made great strides to maintain and improve existing utility systems while accommodating new growth. We look forward to continued improvement to provide safe and reliable services for you.



Friend requests are NOT GUARANTEED, but we do make our best effort to fulfill them. If the person you requested did not request your child, chances are they will not be placed on the same team. If you want to request more than one friend, please sign up as a TEAM. You do not have to fill the full roster, but you will have the responsibility of providing a coach. TEAM REGISTRATION INFORMATION

To avoid confusion, coaches who want to create a team are required to fill out a team roster form at the Lindon Community Center. A digital copy is also available by e-mailing the league coordinator at hsilvey@lindoncity.org. This form will help us insure the placement of the correct players on your team. Max per team varies for each sport. Max numbers CANNOT be exceeded. Players who are listed on your team roster will be placed on your team ONLY if they register BEFORE the program deadline. Those who are listed on your roster, but miss the deadline will NOT be guaranteed a spot on your team. Must have a mixture of grades on your team, unless your grade is the younger one in the league. (In the 1st and 2nd grade league you may have a full roster of 1st graders, but not 2nd graders, etc.)

Deicers lower the melting point of ice to help remove ice and snow from pavement. Sodium chloride (rock salt) is the most common product because it's effective and cheap. However, it is highly corrosive and ecologically damaging. Some deicers are significant sources of phosphorous. Here are some ways to help keep our water supply cleaner:

- ✓ Be sure to keep deicers in a covered area to prevent runoff to the storm system and contamination of ground water.
- ✓ Always apply deicing products according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- ✓ Using the old-fashioned approach of a shovel means eliminating ice and snow without harmful chemicals and with the added benefit of physical exercise.

Why Does It Matter?

Polluted water that enters your storm drain (the grate in the street curb that collects water runoff) **does not get treated**, and instead flows **directly** into local water bodies where it can **harm aquatic life and habitats, contaminate drinking water supplies and recreational waterways, and lessen aesthetic value.**

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Due to all of the growth in Utah County, Republic Services has informed us there is a need to do a recycling service day change in Lindon City. This would simply change the weeks that Republic Services will pick up your recycling. It is currently an every other week service, and they collect the city's recycling on what they call an "A" week and it will be changed to the "B" weeks beginning April 6th. Residents recycling will get picked up on March 30th then again the next week on April 6th and then every other week going forward from that April 6th date. An updated calendar highlighting pick-up dates for the rest of this calendar year will be coming out soon and will be posted on the city website.
