DO I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

Do I need a building permit? That is a question that people call our office and ask quite often. The easiest way to answer that is to call our office and let our staff help you. If you are remodeling, enlarging, altering, demolishing, installing electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing systems you will need a permit.

There are some projects that **Do Not** require a permit, here are a few:

- One story detached accessory structures that the floor area does not exceed 200 square feet.
- Fences not over 7 feet high.
- Retaining walls that do not exceed four feet high from bottom of footing to the top of the wall.
- Prefabricated swimming pools that are less than two feet deep.
- Decks not exceeding 200 square feet in area and are not more than 30 inches above grade.
- Typical building maintenance that are cosmetic in nature, also **do not** require a permit.
- All work exempt from a permit still needs to comply with building codes and Lindon ordinances.

A common project that people do is to finish their basement without getting a permit or inspections. I have seen this happen far too many times and it usually ends up with the owners needing Lindon City to help them get permits or approvals. It is very difficult for us to inspect work that has been done and covered up so that we cannot see the work.

This is something that can cause the owners of the property a problem at some point. Let's say you need to file a claim on your home owner's insurance for damage caused by a fire, damage to your home or an injury to someone in your home. One of the first things an insurance company will do is an investigation to see if construction on you home was done with permits and built to code. If the investigators can determine that work done in your home was done without permits and inspections, they can deny your claim. This really happens, so please let us help you with getting permits and approvals.

The biggest investment most people will ever make is when they buy a home. Homes represent security, a place where people will live, raise their families and share life with others. Whether you own or rent a home, following the building codes during construction or remodeling can help protect your health and safety as well as your investment.

One last thing, please take the time to find the smoke detectors in your home. They should be on the ceiling on each level, on the ceiling of a hallway leading to bedrooms and on the ceiling of a bedroom. Make sure that the battery is replaced yearly and is working properly. You can push the test button to see if it is working, if it is you will know!
