3. Providing educational opportunities and hands-on training for the community on preparedness topics.

Thanks to fantastic community support, our recent 9/11 Drill had a record 90% participation. This is an incredible feat and we want to keep the momentum going to help all in the community be prepared, resilient and ready to work together through any potential emergency situation. That is why Lindon City has set a goal for **every household to have an updated 72-hour emergency kit by the end of 2020!**

Here is what you can do;

- Get a family plan and updated 72-hour emergency kit in place.
- Register your home or business on the Everbridge notification system. You may select to receive emergency and/or regular community news to whatever devices you specify.

We've had a few snowstorms this year, and when it starts to snow our crews are busy plowing our streets. If your street or cul-de-sac is not being plowed, the most probable reason is that there are cars parked along the side of the roads. Please

remember to keep cars parked in the driveway, not on the street between 4 am to 4 pm between November 1st and March 15th. (To help avoid your road being missed it is best to keep cars off streets even during night time hours.) Also remember the order of street plowing is main streets, bus routes, hills and intersections first and then residential streets and cul-de-sacs. Please make life easier for our great snowplow drivers as they work to keep the roads safe for all of us! Also please remember to look out for your neighbors who may need help with snow removal from their driveways and sidewalks. Thanks for your cooperation in advance!

LINDON CITY HISTORICAL COMMISSION

Lindon- Where, when and how did the old churches come to Lindon?

On September 13, 1850, the first LDS settlers arrived to settle Pleasant Grove. At that time, Pleasant Grove was all the land from American Fork Canyon to Provo Canyon and from Utah Lake to Mount Timpanogos. As Pleasant Grove grew, a few settlers began to settle and build along the north-south travel route. As they began to build and farm, the area began to be called "Stringtown" in 1861. This was then all one ward.

In 1890, the PG 2nd Ward was created. And because of the long distance to church, they decided to build a new chapel closer to home. The land was donated by Joseph William Ash. With donations and work supplied by the locals, the chapel was completed in 1891. It was located on the southeast corner of Main Street and 400 North, Lindon. They even hauled clay down from the foothills to make the adobes for their chapel.

In 1915, with the continued growth of the area, the PG 2nd Ward was split, becoming the Lindon 1st Ward and the Orem Windsor Ward. The south boundary was 400 South Lindon. Everything south of that was Orem.

The next chapel was dedicated March 23, 1952. It is now the Lindon Community Center, across from Lindon Elementary. As the new chapel began service, the first chapel was torn down. The land of the old chapel was sold and the now Fugal home was built and lived in by Elder Boyd K. Packer.
