


Lindon City Addresses Affordable Housing

There has been much discussion and media coverage the past few years on population increases and housing affordability. Anyone that has recently purchased, sold, or is trying to purchase a home or rent an apartment has probably been affected by these changes in the housing market.

During the 2019 Utah Legislative session, the legislature passed Senate Bill 34 which requires municipalities to amend their city general plan and to develop a five-year plan for moderate-income (affordable) housing. The State requires when amending the general plan that cities "facilitate a reasonable opportunity for a variety of housing, including moderate-income housing to meet the needs of people of various income levels living, working, or desiring to live or work in the community" (Utah Code Annotated 10-9a-403). The State defines moderate-income housing as "housing occupied or reserved for occupancy by households with a gross household income equal to or less than 80% of the median gross income for households of the same size in the county in which the city is located" (Utah Code Annotated 10-9a-103). The median income for Utah County is estimated at \$67,042 and therefore the 80% income level for Utah County is \$53,633.

Lindon City has always shown strong support for implementing innovative housing programs and partnering with housing groups to meet the needs of the community. On October 1, 2019 the City Council adopted an amendment to the moderate-income housing section of the City General Plan. The plan provides a detailed analysis of housing and population demographics for Lindon as well as outlines housing goals, needs, and policies that the City Council and Planning Commission will be reviewing to continue to support moderate-income housing. From the report, the City believes that one of the most effective ways to support moderate-income housing is encouraging continued use of accessory apartments. If you are interested in adding an accessory apartment, the City has put together a handbook which will help answer many questions and can also be accessed at the above link. Accessory apartments can provide needed moderate-income housing while also offsetting your own housing costs. JANUARY 2020 - Make Commingled Recycling a New Year's Resolution!



WINTER PARKING & SNOW REMOVAL

Winter is here and the snow is on its way! Just a reminder, from November 1st through March 15th, residents are required by ordinance to keep parked vehicles off the roads between the hours of 4:00 AM and 4:00 PM.



(To help avoid your road being missed, it is best to keep cars off the street even during night time hours.) This allows our snowplow operators to clear the snow off

streets. Please keep your sidewalks clear and salted, and be willing to assist your neighbors with special needs with their snow removal as well! We also ask that residents do not push snow into the streets. This practice causes higher snowdrifts to be pushed in front of resident's driveways. Lindon City prioritizes snow removal. First to be plowed are the main arteries, collector streets, and then local and residential streets. During a heavy snowstorm, most of our resources may be spent keeping the main arteries open, and your street may not be plowed until resources become available. Please be patient and know that we will do our best to keep our streets clear. Let's all help to make life easier for our great snowplow drivers as they work to keep the roads safe for all of us!
