When in the Course of Human Events...

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, which among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed...

It thrills me to read the words of the Declaration of Independence. The preamble serves as an introduction, the purpose, and rationale for the declaration, and is followed by declaring the basic human rights, including the rights of equality, life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness are afforded to all citizens.

In the United States Declaration of Independence, the term "unalienable rights" signifies rights that are granted by the Creator and cannot be taken away from the people.

After receiving support from members of Congress on July 2, 1776, the Declaration of Independence was officially ratified and signed on July 4, 1776.

The Declaration of Independence was then followed by the Constitution directing how the ideals of the declaration would be provided and maintained.

There were hardly any new ideas presented in the Constitution that someone hadn't thought of before, but at that time, none of these ideas were being noticeably practiced anywhere. The Constitution is designed to keep the government under control of the people, providing enough authority to provide security, justice, and order, but not enough power for the government to mistreat the people.

I pay tribute to our founding fathers for the miracle of the Declaration of Independence and Constitution and the new system of federal government that was put into practice. The framers themselves felt they had been influenced by the hand of God. I choose to live in Lindon; it is a great place to live, and it is because of the people who live here. Our friends and neighbors here in Lindon are patriotic citizens who provide much service one to another. We live among law abiding citizens.

I am grateful to be able to celebrate the 241st birthday of the United States of America.

2017 Lindon City Municipal Election



Lindon City will be coordinating with Utah County to conduct the 2017 Primary and General Municipal Elections by using Vote by Mail, a system where all registered voters use absentee (Vote by Mail) ballots to vote. Each registered voter will be mailed a ballot and instructions for returning the ballot. Ballots for the Primary Election will be mailed out by Tuesday, July 25; and ballots for the General Election will be mailed out by Tuesday, October 17. **Please note that Lindon City does not need to hold a Primary Election due to the withdrawal of a candidate.** Ballots must either be returned by mail and clearly postmarked before Election Day or placed in the ballot box at the Lindon City Community Center, 25 North Main Street, Lindon, by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Ballots cannot and will not be forwarded by the postal service. All ballots that are determined undeliverable are returned to the County Clerk's office. If you have not received your ballot within two weeks after they are mailed, please call the Utah County Clerks Elections Division office at 801-851-8109 ex #5 or contact the Lindon City Recorder at kmoosman@lindoncity.org.

Public Works Pointers

Lindon has not restricted outdoor watering to certain days of the week, however, in order to conserve our limited water resources the City enforces the policy that states outside watering is prohibited between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm. First-time violators of this policy will receive a door hanger with a reminder of restrictions. Repeated violations may result in your irrigation water being turned off. Please be vigilant for cross-connections, such connections between the culinary and irrigation systems have the potential to contaminate the city's water supply. Thank you for observing these watering hours, and remember to turn off your sprinklers if it's raining! Also, in order to prevent flooding, please make sure that our storm drains are kept free from debris.
