"America the Beautiful" is an American patriotic song. The lyrics were written by Katherine Lee Bates, and the music was composed by Samuel A. Ward. According to Wikipedia the two never met and in 1893, at the age of 33, Bates, an English professor, had taken a train trip to Colorado Springs, Colorado. Several of the sights on her trip inspired her, and they found their way into her poem, including the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago, the "White City" with its promise of the future contained within its gleaming white buildings; and the majestic view of the Great Plains from high atop Pikes Peak. On the pinnacle of that mountain, the words of the poem started to come to her.

The World's Columbian Exposition, also known as the Chicago World's Fair was held in Chicago in 1893 to celebrate the 400th anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in the New World in 1492.

The "patriot dream" of America is a work in progress, as we strive to "see beyond the years", to become what our founders envisioned on our first Independence Day. Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "America is another name for opportunity" and Albert Camus proclaimed, "Freedom is nothing else but a chance to be better." 

Public Works Pointers



Lindon has not restricted outdoor watering to certain days of the week, however, in order to conserve our limited water resources, the City enforces the policy that states outside watering is prohibited between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm.

First-time violators of this policy will receive a door hanger with a reminder of restrictions. Repeated violations may result in your irrigation water being turned off. Please be vigilant for cross-connections, such connections between the culinary and irrigation systems have the potential to contaminate the city's water supply. Thank you for observing these watering hours and remember to turn off your sprinklers if it's raining! Also, in order to prevent flooding, please make sure that our storm drains are kept free from debris. FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS



Because of a result of extreme fire danger along our mountain interface and our west wetland area, Lindon City has a permanent fireworks and open fire restriction in place. These areas include all land west of Interstate 15 within the

Lindon City limits, including the Lindon Marina. This also includes all "Undeveloped Land" within the City Limits as well as all City Parks. Restriction warning signs will be posted near the border of restricted areas. Please help us all to be safe

and to protect our beautiful natural environment and watershed. Please reference the maps below for exact boundaries. Fireworks are not allowed in all Lindon City Parks!

NEW 2018 STATE OF UTAH FIREWORKS LAWS:

Fireworks may only be discharged between the hours of 11am and 11pm on the following dates except as noted: July 2nd - July 5th (July 4th hours extended to midnight), July 22nd - 25th (July 24th hours extended to midnight), December 31st (11am - 1am Jan 1st), and Chinese New Year (11am - 1am the following day). It would have to be shipped several states away in order to process it. This is believed to do more harm to the environment than good.
