### Utility Infrastructure Facts

As each of my children turned 16 years of age and started their first job, it wasn't long until the announcement came that they were ready to buy a car. I would tell them that they could not afford a car even if I gave it to them. They would give me a puzzled look on how that was possible. They knew about the cost of gasoline needs for a car but not about the expenses of operation and maintenance to keep a car running properly and safely. (Licensing, emission's test, inspection, taxes, oil changes, insurance, tires, and major unexpected expenses, transmission, new engine, etc. that are necessary to keep a car running.)

As a city, Lindon typically does not build roads, water or sewer lines. They are typically given to the city by developers as new homes are built and new residents come to live here. The city then bears the burden of the operation and maintenance of this infrastructure.

The utility infrastructure in Lindon is aging. Much of the City's water, secondary water, sewer, and storm water utilities were installed several decades ago. As these utilities age they will eventually fail and need to be repaired and/or replaced. The City's utility rates have historically been set at adequate levels to provide and maintain the services but, for many years, the rates were not sufficient to replace large amounts of aging infrastructure. Over several years, the City has initiated small increases to utility rates for replacement of infrastructure and to keep up with inflationary costs.

The goal has been to become "proactive" in acquiring and maintaining the funds required for infrastructure needs and not be just "reactive", meaning only being able to respond after a water line breaks and just doing the repair.

We are also aware that these increases cause a burden on each of our household budgets.

Lindon City has:

- 86 miles of water lines
- 81 miles of sewer lines
- 49 miles of secondary water lines
- 48 miles storm drain lines
- 13 miles open ditches
- 802 fire hydrants
- 3,285 culinary connections
- 2,600 secondary water connections
- 1.1 billion gallons secondary water delivered annually
- ~410 million gallons culinary water delivered annually

Our goal is to be prepared for the future and avoid a massive increase to utility rates to provide the monies needed for aging infrastructure and to balance the amount of financial burden placed on Lindon residents.

## Public Works Pointers

Please remember as you are doing landscaping projects this summer to not pile anything in the streets such as soil, compost and tree limbs, etc. as these items can obstruct the storm drains. Not only can



obstructions cause flooding, contaminants can get into our storm water system and harm aquatic life. If you schedule a delivery of soil or bark etc., please have these delivered onto your property, not in the street or gutter. While mowing and fertilizing lawns, please make sure that

everything gets swept or blown back onto your lawn where it can be beneficial and not pollute the waterway. Our stormwater goes directly to Utah Lake and does not go through any treatment process; therefore, we need to be conscious of what goes into the storm drains.

Also, in an effort to keep gutters clean, please make sure trees are trimmed to 12 feet above the sidewalk to allow the street sweeper the clearance need to clean the gutters.

### FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS

Because of a result of extreme fire danger along our mountain interface and our west wetland area, Lindon City has a permanent fireworks and open fire restriction in place. These areas include all land west of Interstate 15 within the Lindon City limits, including the Lindon Marina. This also includes all "Undeveloped Land" within the City Limits as well as all City Parks. Restriction warning signs will be posted near the border of restricted areas. Please help us all to be safe and to protect our beautiful natural environment and watershed. Please reference the maps below for exact boundaries. Fireworks are not allowed in all Lindon City Parks (signs will be posted)!
