## Making Conservation a Way of Life

The idea of water conservation following a wet year like we have just experienced may seem unnecessary and far from anyone's mind. However, making conservation a way of life and acting responsibly for our future generations, from a public works standpoint, is an important priority and focus. The word conservation can often be interpreted as an inconvenience and deprivation. Yet small changes in water usage can make a huge difference in conservation efforts.

It is a fact that we need water to live and that clean, safe, usable water is a limited resource. Utah is the second driest state in the country and, according to the State of Utah's Division of Water Resources Conservation Program ([conservewater.utah.gov](http://conservewater.utah.gov)); Utah has the highest water usage per person in the nation. Most water is used during the summer months when rainfall is at its least. Therefore, conserving and using water efficiently is necessary. The State of Utah is promoting a "Use Utah Water Wisely" program, which focuses on increasing the efficiency of water use in order to sustain future water supplies to its customers/citizens. It accomplishes two important goals: (1) that Utah's precious water supply is conserved and (2) that costly water projects may be avoided.

Lindon City appreciates its citizens and their responsible actions regarding water conservation. Small changes do make a big difference in our conservation efforts. By monitoring weather conditions and adjusting water schedules accordingly, citizens can prevent over watering. Also, by following Lindon City's time-of-day water restrictions, watering in the heat of the day, which is less efficient, will be avoided.

For your information, Lindon City is continuing its time-of-day water restrictions to help in the conservation effort. Lindon City's policy prohibits outside watering between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. This avoids the heat of the day watering, which again is less efficient. First time violations will receive a reminder of the restrictions. Repeat violations may result in individual's irrigation water being turned off.



### 2017 MUNICIPAL ELECTION YEAR!

Lindon City will conduct a non-partisan Municipal General Election to elect one (1) Mayoral seat and two (2) City Council seats to serve four-year terms each and one (1) City Council seat to serve a two-year term of office beginning January 2018. Qualified residents of Lindon may become a candidate for office by filling out a "Declaration of Candidacy" in the office of the City Recorder at 100 North State Street, Lindon, Utah, during regular business office hours from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. **between June 1, 2017 and June 7, 2017.** No applications can be received after 5:00 p.m. on June 7, 2017. **Please be advised the city has contracted with Utah County to conduct and all VOTE BY MAIL election this year.** [Click here](#) for more election information.

### Lindon City to Conduct Vote by Mail for 2017 Municipal Election



The Lindon City Council recently voted to authorize Utah County to conduct the 2017 Primary and General Municipal Elections by

using Vote by Mail, a system where all registered voters use absentee (Vote by Mail) ballots to vote. Each registered voter will be mailed a ballot and instructions for returning the ballot. Ballots for the Primary Election will be mailed out by Tuesday, July 25; and ballots for the General Election will be mailed out by Tuesday, October 17. Ballots must either be returned by mail and clearly postmarked before Election Day or placed in the ballot box at the Lindon City Community Center, 25 North Main Street, Lindon, by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Ballots cannot and will not be forwarded by the postal service. All ballots that are determined undeliverable are returned to the County Clerk's office. If you have not

received your ballot within two weeks after they are mailed, please call the Utah County Clerks Elections Division office at 801-851-8109 ex 5

### June: Get the Facts about Cardboard Recycling

- Cardboard and paper make up 41% of the solid waste stream coming from neighborhoods just like yours.
- Remember to place any cardboard or paper products in your blue recycling bin.
- To make sure you have plenty of room for other recyclable items break down your cardboard boxes.
- Remember that overfilling your recycling container makes it difficult for Republic Services to empty your container.
- After your cardboard is sorted at the recycling facility it is packed into large bales like the one pictured above!

### Public Works Pointers

Lindon has not restricted outdoor watering to certain days of the week, however, in order to conserve our limited water



resources the City enforces the policy that states outside watering is prohibited between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm. First-time violators of this policy will receive a door hanger with a reminder of restrictions. Repeated violations may result in your irrigation

water being turned off. Please be vigilant for cross-connections, such connections between the culinary and irrigation systems have the potential to contaminate the city's water supply.

Thank you for observing these watering hours, and remember to turn off your sprinklers if it's raining! Also, in order to prevent flooding, please make sure that our storm drains are kept free from debris. For any questions regarding possible cross-connections please contact our public works department at 801-796-7954.

## Notice to Residents of Lindon City

Utah Lake has been listed as an impaired waterway by the EPA and the state of Utah. It has high levels of phosphates (household and carwash soaps and cleaners), nitrates (fertilizers) and total solids. Low water levels and high temperatures cause naturally occurring algae blooms, and these blooms are fed by the high levels of nitrates and phosphates.

We need your help to keep our waterways clean. Lindon City works to keep the streets swept in order to reduce the amount of debris in our storm water drains, as contents of the drains go directly into the lake untreated. We also watch for dirt runoff and tracking from construction sites. As Lindon residents, you can take the following steps to do your part:

- Please avoid over-fertilizing lawns and sweep up fertilizer that lands on sidewalks and streets that can wash into storm drains.
- Keep storm drains free from yard waste and debris. When storm drains are clogged, flooding may occur.
- Do not dump pollutants into gutters, curb inlets or open ditches.

The EPA and State of Utah require us to enforce pollution offenses. It is a Class B misdemeanor to dump in ditches or gutters. We are trying to educate through public outreach to reduce and eliminate these problems. Please do your part to keep our storm drain system clog- and pollutant-free. It may be your neighborhood that you prevent from flooding! Thank you for your help in keeping our waterways clean.

## Notice to Lindon City Utility Customers

In compliance with Utah State Law, Lindon City is disclosing proposed transfer of funds from the utility enterprise funds to the general fund as part of the Fiscal Year 2018 budget (July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018). These funds will be used in supplementing such city services as fire, police, street maintenance, administration, parks & recreation, and other city functions. Similar transfers have been made annually from the enterprise funds to the general fund in order to help maintain low property taxes in Lindon. Estimated amounts to be transferred from utility enterprise funds to the general fund are as follows:

- Water Fund \$266,787 (10.9% of fund expenditures)
- Sewer Fund \$233,768 (7.0% of fund expenditures)
- Solid Waste Collection Fund \$20,300 (4.6% of fund expenditures)
- Storm Water Drainage Fund \$108,528 (11.6% of fund expenditures)

A public hearing to receive comment on the proposed enterprise fund transfers and the FY2018 Lindon City Budget will occur on June 20, 2017 at the Lindon City Center, 100 N. State Street, Lindon, UT 84042. Interested parties are invited to attend and make comment.
