Water Conservation and Awareness

Utah is the second driest State in the United States and one of the highest water users, which means conservation should be a way of life and an important priority and focus for us all. Although Lindon City was fortunate to have some spring rainfall this year, the winter snowpack and runoff have been extremely low. The State of Utah's Division of Water Resources Conservation Program, has many ideas for us to help accomplish necessary water conservation.

The state's goal of "Water, use it Wisely" and "Slow the Flow, Save H2O" found at conservewater.utah.gov has great resources and information for citizens to utilize. Here are just a few suggestions offered to help us with water conservation.

- Fix leaking faucets and toilets
- Do not leave water running unattended
- Refrain from hosing down driveways
- Recognize and report concerns
- Monitor weather conditions and adjust watering schedules accordingly
- Water during cooler parts of day

For your information, Lindon City is continuing its time-of-day water restrictions to help in the conservation effort. Lindon City's policy prohibits outside watering between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. First time violations will receive a reminder of the restrictions. Repeat violations may result in individual's irrigation water being turned off.

Warning: The secondary water system is un-treated water from canals, ditches and springs. Do not drink from a secondary water connection. Do not connect the secondary water system to the culinary water in any way. Cross-connections have the potential to contaminate your home drinking water and the city's culinary water system.

Lindon City appreciates its citizens and their responsible actions regarding conservation. Seemingly small measures taken by individuals, can have a huge impact on water conservation. For more information regarding xeriscape and other conservation ideas, visit the Central Utah Gardens, located at the Central Utah Water Conservation District Offices in Orem, Utah.

June: Get the Facts about Cardboard Recycling!



Cardboard and paper make up 41% of the solid waste stream coming from neighborhoods just like yours! Remember to place any cardboard or paper products in your blue recycling

bin. To make sure you have plenty of room for other recyclable items be sure to break down your cardboard boxes. Remember that overfilling your recycling container

makes it difficult for Republic Services to empty your container. After your cardboard is sorted at the recycling facility it is packed into large bales like the one pictured above! We culminated our reading and discussions with a skype meeting with the author, U of U Law Professor Amos Guiora, but there was an additional bonus to our correspondence and preparation. Our reading and consequent conversations happened in the weeks building up to Representative Brian King's proposed bill HB 125 before the state legislature. The Duty to Assist bill which sprung from Amos' book, didn't pass, but we were able to talk to Amos right after the defeat, and we did watch the proceedings that were streamed live on the internet. It was a great learning experience that was greatly enhanced with the addition of hard copy books. Most students had*

difficulty reading the PDF on a computer screen, so the hard copy books were a lifesaver. Thanks again!

LINDON DAYS ORIGINS

The origin of the Lindon Days celebration dates back to the early days of Lindon when it was called the "Lindon Fair"



and is one activity that has stood the test of time! The "Fair" was discontinued for many years and then in March of 1940 it was presented as a proposal for a Community Fair to be held again. A Committee was organized and the Fair has

been held at the Lindon City Park each August ever since. The "Fair" was originally held at the old church grounds at 400 North and Main Street. It consisted mainly of displays and a horse-pulling contest. A big tent was set up to house the exhibits of fruit and vegetables, bottled goods, handiwork, and other arts and crafts. Winners of the exhibited items were awarded a sack of flour or sugar!
