

Lead Lifeguard

Starting Pay Rate: \$9.07/hr

Nature of Work

Under close supervision of the LAC Manager, and Aquatic Supervisor will perform professional duties ensuring performance and supervision of the lifeguard staff and the aquatic facility. Ensure the safety of the patrons in and around the pools, monitoring swimmers and guests, and enforcing all safety rules and health regulations.

Example of Duties

- Oversees the lifeguards on duty as assigned by the supervisor.
- Supervise swimmers in the pool and on the decks. Oversee patrons swimming ability and provides monitoring.
- Enforce rules and regulations of the aquatic facility.
- Report safety issues and hazards to appropriate personnel.
- Provide first aid, CPR, and assistance in and around the pool and the aquatic facility; handles emergencies as required.
- Prepares records, accident reports, and other administrative paperwork.
- Maintains the pool area by putting in and taking out lane lines, replacing equipment, cleaning decks and drains, and picking up trash in the facility.
- Removes unnecessary equipment from the pool areas, locker rooms, hallways, and first aid station; monitors safety and cleanliness in all wet areas.
- Assists in the instruction of Swimming Lessons and Water Safety.
- Participates in the record keeping of accidents, rescues, water temperature, and water chemical testing.
- Maintains clean environment; performs janitorial duties as required or assigned to include body fluid cleanup, sanitizing area, and housekeeping.
- Performs related duties as required.

Minimum Qualifications

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- High school graduate or equivalent.
- Two (1) years of paid lifeguard experience or previous lifeguard supervisory experience.

Requirements

- Possess American Red Cross Lifeguard Training Certification, CPR for the Professional Rescuer and First Aid.
- Ability to work mornings, mid-day, evenings, weekends, and holidays.
- Will be subjected to a drug test and background test before employment.
