

STAYING CONNECTED (LITERALLY) TO LINDON CITY

Most of us will recall the problems Sandy City encountered last month when a pump malfunctioned and allowed a large amount of fluoride into its water system. Besides the potential health problems, the acidic nature of the water contributed to the discharge of some heavy metals such as lead and copper from pipes. (Lindon City does not fluoridate its water.)

Needless to say, this was an unfortunate situation for Sandy’s residents and for the city. Sandy has made efforts to address how this problem occurred and to improve its efforts in contacting citizens in various ways in a timely manner. Some citizens indicated that they felt they were not informed quickly enough to take the proper precautions.

Some years ago, Lindon City contracted with Everbridge, a company that provides a mass notification system that enables its users to send information to individuals or groups using lists, locations, and visual intelligence. This comprehensive notification system helps those whose contact information has been provided to the city to receive notifications before, during and after all events whether they be an emergency or a non-emergency situation. These situations might include severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, or needed evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods. The city has used the system before when it dealt with a past water issue and for other notifications.

You can create an account and then provide a profile which includes information such as primary and secondary cell phone numbers, land lines, and work phone numbers. You can also provide primary and secondary email addresses. Finally, you can designate the type of alerts you’d like to be subscribed to, including those from fire and police departments, those regarding power or water outages, and those related to public works issues.

If you work in Lindon City but don’t reside here, you can also provide contact information so that you can be fully informed.

We hope all of our residents and those who work within the city will avail themselves of this system so that they can take needed actions in case of an emergency or other situation.



Why can't glass go in my co-mingled bin?



While glass is recyclable it must be taken to a glass drop-off container. It **cannot** be placed into your co-mingled bin. This is because co-mingled recycling is sorted by human hands. When glass is dropped into a recycling truck from your container it breaks and creates sharp edges that are dangerous. If you wish to recycle your glass material please take it to a drop-off location. The nearest glass container to Lindon city is behind the Pleasant Grove City office building. 

HOW I CAME TO LINDON

This year Utah will celebrate the 150th year of the driving of the final Gold Spike in the Transcontinental Railroad. It will be officially re-enacted at Promontory Summit, near Ogden. This made it possible for many more to easily come to Utah. And because of this, many could come to Lindon. You can read about this in the “Lindon our Town” book (page 27).

In 1873 the Utah Southern Railroad Company built a railroad through Lindon. Later this line merged with others and became the Utah Central Railroad. This coming of the railroad put an end to pioneer hardships. It brought closer touch with the outside world and helped bring additional prosperity, both to those working to build the line and to those who sold commodities to the workers.

The building of the railroads in Utah is another good example of pioneers ability to cooperate, a characteristic which made them unusually successful as colonizers. In the words of Colonel A.B. Carr, of the Union Pacific Railroad:

‘The Utah Central is the only line west of the Missouri River that has been built entirely without government subsidies. It has been built wholly with money wrung from soil which, a few years ago, we used to consider a desert, by the strong arms of the men and women who stand before me. Everything used in its construction, even the last spike, is the produce of the country.’”
