2017 LINDON CITY COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The upcoming Municipal General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017. Just as with the primary election Lindon City will be conducting the general election using Vote By Mail (VBM) in coordination with the Utah County Clerk's office who will coordinate and administer the Election through Vote by Mail. As long as your voter registration is up to date by October 24th, you'll be mailed a ballot for the general election. Visit vote.utah.gov to register or to check your voter information. The post office won't forward ballots, so make sure your mailing address is current on vote.utah.gov.

Also, if you've changed the way you sign your name, you will need to update your signature as part of your voter registration information. Ballots are mailed approximately 30 days before the election.

There will be a voter service center for all of Lindon City residents at the Lindon Community Center, 25 N. Main on election day, November 7th for those who would like to drop off their ballot or those needing to vote provisionally. SECONDARY WATER SYSTEM TO SHUT DOWN FOR THE WINTER

The pressurized irrigation system will be shut off on or around October 15th. Please plan your watering schedules accordingly. When the system is shut down please be sure to turn off your sprinkler system, open any manual drains and close the main valve in your PI box. This will prevent unintended flooding in the spring, and may help avoid frozen and broken pipes this winter. In order to close your main valve open the green PI box located somewhere in the yard, typically near the sidewalk or street. When you open the lid and be sure to look for spiders that like to hide in these types of spaces! To close the valve, turn the valve handle or key so it is perpendicular to the pipe. Then replace the lid making sure it is securely in place. Every season there are a handful of residents who forget to do these very important steps and suffer unnecessary flooding in the spring. Please don't be the one affected next spring and take the time now to completely turn off your sprinkling system. Thanks!



NOTICE TO RESIDENTS



State law requires cities to notify homeowners about the public vs. private ownership of water and sewer lines. Any necessary repairs to the water line that runs between the home and the water meter are the responsibility of the homeowner and any necessary repairs to the sewer main are the responsibility of the homeowner, as show above. These responsibilities may be different for homeowners in an HOA or on private roads.

LINDON MONTHLY RECYCLING FACTS


October: Get the Facts about Landfills! How do they work?

Have you ever wondered what happens to your trash after you throw it away? Check out this graphic which will teach you about the basic components of a landfill. Recycling allows us

to extend the lifespan of our landfills and keep our environment clean.

The basic parts of a landfill are shown below:

- Bottom liner system: Keeps trash and contaminated liquids from groundwater
- Cells: Where trash is stored within the landfill
- Drainage system: collects rain water from landfill
- Leachate collection system: collects water and other fluids that drain through the landfill and contain contamination
- Methane collection system: Collects methane gas that is formed when trash decays
- Covering: seals off the top of the landfill
