## Quilt Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Barn Panel - Teal (A):

- Fussy cut (1) $23^{\prime \prime} \times 301 / 2 \prime$ panel.

From the Chicken Wire - Red (B), cut:

- (2) $13 / 4 " \times 301 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $13 / 4 " \times 25 \frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips.
- (1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (13) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
-(4) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (52) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Starry Basic - Indigo (C), cut:
- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 32 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " $\times 281 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (1) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (4) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
-(1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips.


## From the Houndstooth - Green (D), cut:

- (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 281 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (12) $27 / 8 "$ squares.


## From the Starry Basic - Green (E), cut:

- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 361 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 281 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips.
- (1) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (2) $27 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Houndstooth - Brown (F), cut:

- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 361 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 281 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (3) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) $27 / 8 "$ squares

From the Starry Basic - Cream (G), cut:

- (4) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (52) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (12) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Starry Basic - Black (H), cut:
- (3) $11 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 521 / 2 "$ strips.
- (3) $11 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 461 / 2 "$ strips.
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (5) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
-(6) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Starry Basic - Brown (I), cut:
-(3) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Chicken Wire -Tan (J), cut:
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (3) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Chicken Wire - Lt. Teal (K), cut:
- (1) $27 / 8 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (7) $27 / 8$ " squares.
-(2) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Starry Basic - Gold (L), cut:
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (13) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Starry Basic - Red (M), cut:
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (2) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Characters - Tan (N), cut:
- (1) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (7) $27 / 8 "$ squares.

From the Characters - Teal (O), cut:
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (7) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Starry Basic - Orange ( P ), cut:
-(1) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (6) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Starry Basic - Blue (Q), cut:
-(1) $27 / 8 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (3) $27 / 8 "$ squares.
From the Words - Navy (Backing), cut:

- (2) 58 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the $58 " \times 66 "$ back.


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Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) $13 / 4 " \times 301 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of the 23 " x $301 / 2$ "
Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $13 / 4 " \times 251 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $241 / 2 " \times 32 "$ to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).
2. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 32 "$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $13 / 4 "$ x $281 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block (Fig. 2).

3. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 281 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block (Fig. 3).

5. Repeat Step 4 and use Figure 7 for fabric identification to make the designated number of $21 / 2$ " units from $27 / 8$ " squares. These units all include a Fabric F square.

6. Repeat Step 4 and use Figure 8 for fabric identification to make the designated number of $21 / 2$ " units from $27 / 8$ " squares. These units all include a Fabric I square.


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7. Follow Figure 9 and sew (28) assorted $21 / 2$ " units into two rows of (14) units each. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 281 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to the top of the assorted units row. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 281 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip to the top of the Fabric E strip to make (1) Top/Bottom Inner Border (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Top/Bottom Inner Border.

9. Repeat Step 4 using (8) $27 / 8$ " Fabric D squares and (8) $27 / 8$ " Fabric L squares to make (16) $21 / 2 "$ DL units (Fig. 13).

10. Repeat Step 4 using (8) $27 / 8$ Fabric G squares and (8) $27 / 8$ " Fabric B squares to make (16) $21 / 2 "$ GB units (Fig. 14).

11. Place (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric K square on the left side of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 15). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 15). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 16). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

12. Place another $21 / 2$ " Fabric K square on the right side of the $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 17). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 17). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 18). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) KCK unit.
13. Repeat Steps 11-12 to make (16) KCK units total.

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14. Sew (4) GB units together to make (1) pinwheel block. Repeat to make (4) pinwheel blocks total.
15. Sew (1) KCK unit to each side of (1) pinwheel block. Sew (1) DL unit to each end of (1) KCK unit. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the pinwheel block to make (1) Corner Block (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (4) Corner Blocks total.

Quilt Top Assembly
(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)
16. Sew (1) Side Inner Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Corner Block to each end of (1) Top/Bottom Inner Border. Repeat with the second Top/Bottom Inner Border. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
17. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 521 / 2 "$ Fabric $H$ strip to the each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 461 / 2 "$ Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
18. Sew (14) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G squares and (13) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric B squares together, alternating them, to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.
19. Sew (13) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric B squares and (12) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G squares together, alternating them, to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
20. Layer and quilt as desired.
21. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
22. Bind as desired.

## Barn Panel Interactive Characters

23. Cut the bottom portion of the panel off. Iron a fusible bonding to the backside of the characters. Cut around each character, leaving $1 / 8$ " to $1 / 4$ " of fabric.
24. Remove the release paper and iron each character to a piece of felt, leaving at least $1 / 2 "$ between each piece.
25. Zigzag around the raw edge of the fabric. Cut the felt $1 / 8$ " to $1 / 4 "$ from the fabric.

Little ones can use these to learn the animals, matching them to the animals in the barn. You can attach a piece of ribbon and hang them on a button attached to the quilt or use a small piece of Velcro. We also suggest using the quilt as a mat for the little ones to drive their small tractors or trucks on it, using the brown chevron portion as the winding road around the barn. If you want more characters, you can use the all over print to create more.
