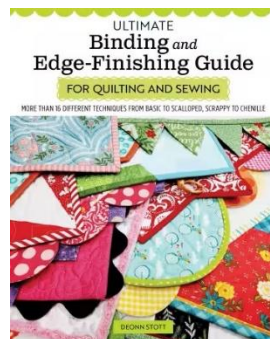

Class Description: You will learn many different techniques for binding your quilt including curved edge binding, faced binding, flange binding, scrappy binding and binding applied entirely by machine. You will also learn a quick easy way to cut bias binding.

Supplies:

REQUIRED: walking foot that fits your specific sewing machine, 6-1/2" x 24-1/2" OR 8-1/2" x 24-1/2" ruler

Highly recommended:

book – There's More Than One Way to Bind a Quilt; 2-1/2" x 30" ruler;

Fabric: You will need 2 quilt sandwiches that are 8"x 12" and 2 quilt sandwiches that are 10" square. You can make these by basting together two pieces of plain fabric with a piece of batting in the middle and just quilting a large grid pattern. Please prepare these before coming to class. You will also need 2 different fabrics: one piece of fabric that is 3/8 yd (we will be making binding from this piece so solid color or scrap fabric is fine to use). For the second fabric, which should contrast with fabric #1, you will need one piece that is 2-1/2"x40".

Thread: colored thread to match the fabric you are cutting up for binding. (I suggest using a 50-weight thread for all the stitching.)

Other: Sewing machine in good repair; 1/4" seam foot, walking foot, machine needles (microtex sharp 80/12 or 90/14 are recommended; new one in machine and spare needle), Rotary cutter with new blade (45mm recommended) and spare blade; fabric scissors; thread snips; mechanical pencil; straight pins; seam ripper; hand sewing needle and cutting mat large enough to accommodate a fat quarter (18" x 24" minimum size)

Optional: small iron and ironing surface

Please be very comfortable with your sewing machine. Don't bring a machine that you have never sewn with before. If you have one you haven't used for a very long time, dust it off and familiarize yourself again with how it works and practice making a 1/4 inch seam.
