Glory - Miniature Flag Quilt

12 ½" x 8 ¾" (with optional border)

Fabric Requirement

- Scraps of at least 6 mostly red fabrics to cut
  2 ½" squares of each print (14 squares).
- Scraps of at least 6 mostly white fabrics to cut
  2 ½" squares of each print (12 squares).
- Scraps of at least 3 mostly blue fabrics to cut
  2 ½" squares of each print (6 squares).
- Optional border: 1/8<sup>th</sup> yard border fabric.
- Backing: 1 Fat Quarter
- Binding: 1/8<sup>th</sup> yard (more depending on size of optional border).

Note: Each seam for miniature quilts is a SCANT 4" seam allowance.

When the term 'mostly' is used with the colors, it means that the fabric will read as that color. In other words, a white with small red dots will read as white. Do not choose a print with large prints that as it is cut into small squares will not read as the chosen color. Use small prints that the background is the predominant color in the square.

## Glory – Miniature – $12 \frac{12}{2}$ x 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ (with optional border)

Read all instructions prior to beginning project.


Cut:

14 Mostly Red 2 ½" squares

12 Mostly White 2 1/2" squares

6 Mostly Blue 2 1/2" squares


\*What does nesting seams mean? When matching up squares or rows together to make seams line up perfectly, press the seam allowance of one going left and the other going right. Putting right sides together the 'bump' of the seams will line up next to each other with the seams aligned. Pin well and sew.

















- With 2 red 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, cut in half to make 4 rectangles. You will need 3.
- With Blue squares, sew 2 rows of 3 squares. Sew rows together.
- Layout your design as shown below.









## Top Unit:

- Sew red rectangles end to end for the top row.
- Press each red/white rectangle with seams going opposite directions so you can nest the seams as you sew each rectangle together into 2 horizontal rows of 3 for the top right section.
- Sew the first 3 rows together, nesting seams (red only, red/white, red/white)
- Measure the height of the red/white top unit and trim the scant amount necessary on the top and bottom of the blue unit.
- Sew the blue unit to the left of the red/white unit.

#### **Bottom Unit:**

- Sew 3 horizontal rows of 6 red/white rectangles pressing opposite directions to nest seams.
- Sew each row together with seams pressed opposite directions to nest seams.
- Sew to the bottom of the blue/red/white unit.

# Glory – Miniature – $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ " (with optional border)


Square up the miniature quilt (approximately 12 ½ x 8 ¾")

Your measurement may be slightly different depending on your seam allowances and that's okay as long as you are consistent with the same seam allowance.

### Optional Border:

You can add a border to Glory by cutting 2 strips the length of the top and bottom ( 1 % x WOF). Sew to the top and bottom. Press towards the border.

Measure the sides. Cut 2 strips to this measurement and sew to the sides. Press toward the border.



Layer with batting and backing. Simply quilt or use your decorative stitches to quilt. Bind with 1 % x WOF strip for a narrow binding.

Place wrong side of binding along the back edge and stitch with ¼" seam, mitering the corners as you turn. Press and turn toward the front. Turn under twice. Press and stitch along the edge to finish your binding.

Display your Glory flag by adding a hanging sleeve, using clips to hang or as table décor.
