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**Supply List: Project Bag 2.0**

**Dates & Times: Sunday, April 23, 12:30-5:30pm**

**OR**

**Tuesday, June 20, 27 10:30-1:00pm or 6:30-9:00pm**

### **Pattern Requirement\*:**

**“Project Bag 2.0”** by Patterns by Annie. We will be making the Large size.

### **Fabric Requirements:**

**Main Fabric** – 1 fat quarter (this is the fabric for the back of the bag)

**Lining** – 1 fat quarter (this is the fabric that you will see through the vinyl window.

**Coordinating Fabric** (borders, binding, handle, zipper pull) – ¼ yd

**Border** – 1 Fat Eight

**“Soft and Stable”** – One 18”x 58” package – one package will make all 4 bags in the pattern. If you want to make 1 or 2 bags get the 18”x 36” package

**Fusible Interfacing** (Pellon 101 preferred) – 1/3 yd

### **Handbag Zipper:**

One 15 ½” or longer single slide zipper.

Optional - For all sizes – One package of By Annie “Zippers by the Yard” – Highly recommended! You can make all 4 sizes with one package and have leftover zipper tape for other projects.

**Clear Vinyl** – ¼ yd

### **Tools Required\*:**

**Thread** to match your fabrics and zippers

**Rotary Cutter**

**Ruler** (at least 6 ½” by 24” in length

**Clover Clips** – These are important! You will need these clips to hold the pieces together while sewing as the layers are too thick for pins.

The clips come in either a 10-pack or 50-pack. The 10-pack gives you enough clips for the project but I feel it’s worth it to invest in the 50-

pack because you will find these clips indispensable for any project that involves thick layers. Also fantastic for attaching binding to a quilt.

**Stylus** – Wonderful to use to keep thick layers and zippers straight while sewing the pieces together. You can use the point of a seam ripper instead, but a stylus works much better.

**1 pkg size 90 Topstitch or Jeans needles**

**Pins**

**Marking pencil or chalk** (my favorite is the Clove Chaco liner marker in white, yellow or gray).

**Notes:** The pattern comes with a \$5 coupon for a video that highlights the construction of the bag. I strongly recommend using the coupon and viewing the video before class to get a better understanding of how this bag is made.

If you are bringing your own machine, please bring, if available, a ¼” foot and an edge stitch foot. If you are a **BERNINA** owner and your machine uses the feet with the “red” numbers, please bring, if you have any, a #37 (1/4” foot) and #10 (edge stitch foot). We have a few of these feet available for our classroom machines but we are in short supply.

Please pick out your fabric and notions before the class begins.
